IN MEMORY OF FIRE VICTIMS

Chicago, Ill., Dec. 22—Archbishop Quigley presided at a requiem high mass celebrated at Holy Name Cathedral this morning in memory of Fire Marshal James Horan and a number of his men who met death in the Chicago Stockyards fire a year ago today. Last week a fund of \$211,000 raised by popular subscription was distributed among the twenty-one widows of the fire victims.

TURKEYS PLENTIFUL AND PRICES LOWER

Toronto, Dec. 20.—"What is the outlook for Christmas turkey?"

This question was put to a number of poultry dealers today, and while a great diversity of opinion prevails among the dealers, the probability is that this requisite of the holiday dinner will be a few cents cheaper than the price prevailing for the past three or four years.

"Turkeys will undoubtedly be cheaper this year," stated M. P. Mallon, a large dealer in St. Lawrence market. "The country is full of fowl of all kinds. The farmers would not dispose of their stock in any quantities during the Thanksgiving season and have not been sending many fowl into the market for the past two or three months, with the result that they have a large number on hand."

"One great factor in regulating the price in Toronto and vicinity, is the demand from the west on the Ontario farmer for their supply. This year, instead of buying from Ontario farmers, the Western Canadian dealers imported their supply almost exclusively from the State of Dakota, leaving the Ontario supply for eastern consumption. Some idea of the significance of this action on their part will be gathered when it is remembered that from the Counties of Kent and Essex alone last year over one million pounds of turkeys were shipped to the west."

Good turkeys could be purchased on Saturday for 21 and 22 cents per pound and as yet there are no great quantities arriving. Geese were 15 cents and ducks 17 and 18 cents. With a little colder weather the dealers expect the market to be flooded with fowl of all kinds, and then the true state of the market will be revealed.

Another factor in the housewife's favor this year is the fact that Christmas falls on Monday and wholesalers will not be inclined to take a chance of holding over any quantities unless it is exceptionally cold weather.

The condition of the roads leading into the city was held by one man as a reason for a probable shortage in the supply having been exhausted. Relief claim that it is cheaper to send the fowl in by express than to bring it to market themselves. Some of the dealers have had agents through the country buying up large amounts of fowl, but in almost every instance the farmer has refused to set a price on his supply, preferring to ship them in and take the prevailing market quotations.

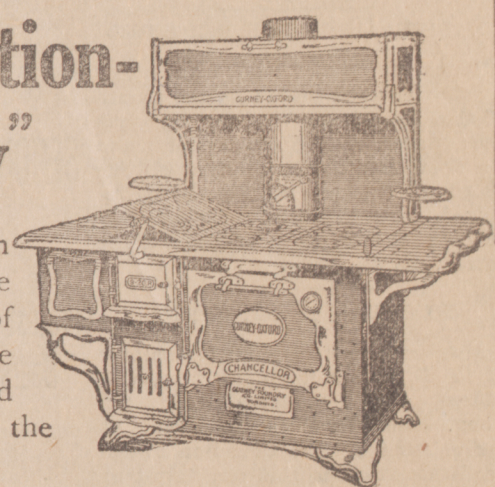
