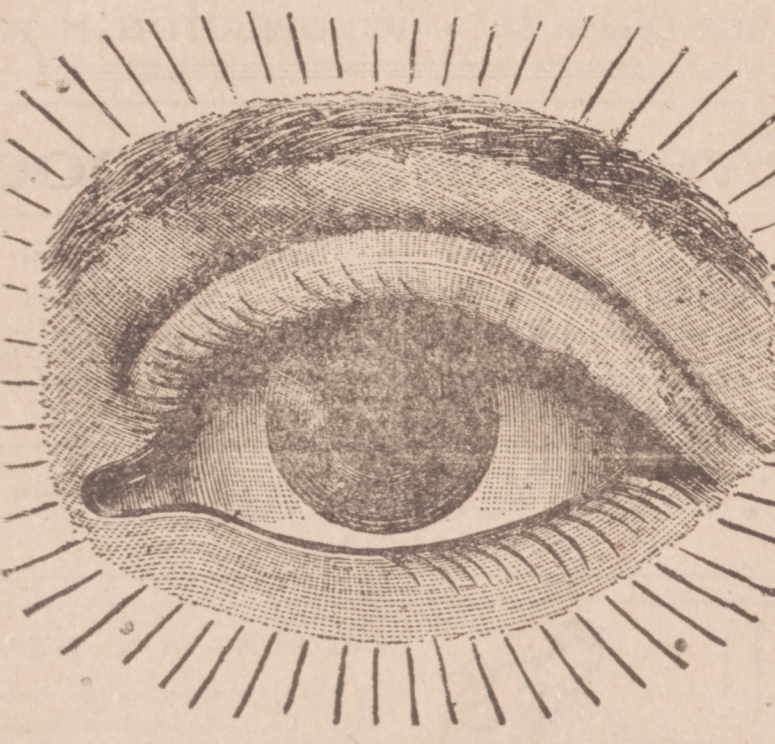

CHASE RESIGNS THE MANAGERSHIP OF HIGHLANDERS

Will Stay with Team Covering First Base at Same Salary--Arrangement Satisfactory

New York, Nov. 21.--Hal Chase resigned as manager of the New York American League Club at a conference this afternoon with Frank Farrell, owner of the club. Hal, however, will not leave the team. He will play first base next season and will get the same salary.

When the new deal was closed Chase said:

"I'm the happiest ball-player in the world. It's a better thing for the club and I'm sure I can hit .300 next season."

"I don't know just who will be the manager," said Pres. Farrell, "but I'll try to obtain a good one. Chase will continue at first base."

The first intimation that there would be a change in the management of the Highlanders came in a dispatch from California about six weeks ago. Bill Lange, the former Chicago player, gave out part of the contents of a letter in which Frank Farrell asked him what he thought of Harry Wolverton for manager.

Mr. Farrell denied, at the time that he had opened negotiations with Wolverton, but a week ago came a report from San Antonio, where the baseball magnates were holding a convention, that Wolverton had been asked to assume the management of the Yankees.

FAMOUS HORSES SOLD FOR LESS THAN TEN DOLLARS

Lexington, Ky., Nov. 21.--Small prices, said to have been caused by the adverse turf legislation, were realized in the thoroughbred horse sales here today. Eighty-six horses averaged only \$68 a head.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties--Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties--Must reside upon the homestead or (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties--Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate erect a house worth \$300.00.
