Hysterical Headlines which it Published During the Campaign in 1908 Failed to Win Votes---Smith Was Then a "Sure Winner" in Carleton and "Pugsley must Leave the Cabinet"---The Liberal Party was Tottering to Its Fall on that Occasion

The federal elections of October 26th, 1908, resulted in an overwhelming defeat for the Tory party in Canada. In New Brunswick the party candidates in eleven out of thirteen constituencies were simply buried out of sight and a similar fate awaits them on Sept. 21st.


