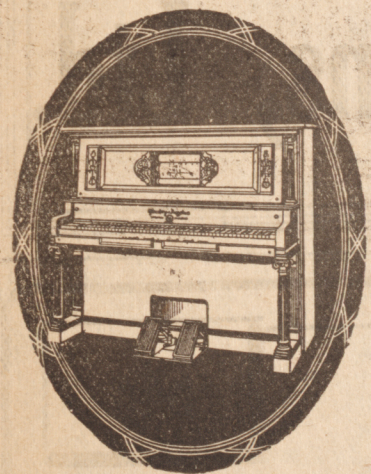

THE LIBERAL PARTY AND LABOR QUESTION

(Halifax Chronicle)

It is well that those who profess the same of Liberal should be ready to accord their support to the claims of Labor to proper representation in Parliament, and to recognize that the workingman enjoys equally with men of all classes the right to participate in the higher functions of government and legislation the only qualifying consideration, of course, being personal fitness for duties of a representative and legislative character. This is consonant with the principles of the Liberal Party, and indeed is of the essence of true Liberalism which, as Premier Murray admirably defines it, means equal rights for all.

It is with pleasure, therefore, that we welcome and beg leave to second the suggestion put forward by the Acadia Recorder, that the Liberal Party of Halifax should express its sympathy with the interests and aspirations of the workmen, in a practical way, by endorsing the candidature of Mr. John Joy, the nominee of the Labor Party for the House of Assembly. Our contemporary, we are sure, is giving expression to the preponderant sentiment of the Liberals of this constituency, and The Morning Chronicle is glad to endorse the suggestion and to associate itself cordially with all that our contemporary has so admirably said in emphasizing the identity of the interests of Labor and Liberalism.

The Liberal Party is broad and big enough to embrace all classes, but it is historically and essentially the party of the people from whom it draws its strength and to whose interests and welfare it is devoted. It has been the valiant champion of the rights of the masses and the resolute foe of caste, special privilege and arrogant Toryism. In Nova Scotia its great leaders, Howe, Fielding and Murray, have been men of the plain people, and so because of its origin and its leadership and its principles it has been at all times thoroughly in sympathy with the claims of labor, for in the special sense, the interests and wellbeing of the workman.

The Liberal party has given the workman the privilege of the franchise, it has given him the Workmen's Compensation Act, the Industrial Disputes Act and many other measures for the amelioration of the conditions of working, and it is willing and ready to respond to any reasonable appeal for the betterment of the position of the laboring masses of the country.

Nothing has been more significant in modern politics than the rise of the Labor Party in Great Britain, where there is now in the House of Commons a labor representation of more than 40 members. In the Old Country Liberals and Laborites are working in perfect harmony and while maintaining their separate organizations and their independence of action, they present to all intents and purposes a united front. They may differ in details but they stand as one for the same general principles of popular government. And so here as in the Old Country Liberalism and Labor are synonymous.

In his speech at the banquet the other evening Premier Murray spoke truly when he said that the record of the Liberal party shows an unflagging interest in the welfare of the workman—an interest which has involved the best thought and best efforts of its leaders. This is a declaration which will be cordially endorsed, we are convinced by the rank and file of the Liberal Party throughout the Province.

In Halifax now a special opportunity presents itself to the Liberal Party to give direction and effect to their leader's words. The Labor Party of this City have nominated as their candidate for the Legislature Mr. John Joy who possesses in large measure the confidence and respect of his fellow workmen, and who in so far as we have observed his walk and conversation would worthily represent their interests in the House of Assembly. He is thoughtful, serious-minded, safe and sane in his leadership, upright and honorable in conduct.
