Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency on certain conditions, by father mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader. Duties-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his home stead on a farm of at least eight acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son. daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside upon the homestead or (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain dis tricts. Price \$3.00 per acre. Duties -Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate ererect a house worth \$300.00.
