

WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole heac on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eight; acres, solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, firm.
