JOHN PALMER CO., LTD., ARRANGE REORGANIZATION

John Kilburn Elected President of Company, R. W. McLellan Managing Director--Capital to be Increased--Erection of New Factory Building to Begin as Soon as Possible--Important Industry.

The annual meeting of the John Palmer Co., Ltd., was held Saturday afternoon at which officers were elected and the regular business of the year transacted. The basis for the re-organization of the company was also worked out.

Those present or represented by proxy were, John Kilburn, A. B. Kitchen, Edward Moore, W. A. McLellan, Charles K. Palmer, R. W. McLellan, Sigmund Cahn, of New York, and G. A. Kimball, of St. John.

The output of the Palmer factory is sold from the International Foundry to the Yukon and from Newfoundland to the Pacific Coast. The larrigans and shoe-packs manufactured in this city are to be found in

OFFICERS ELECTED.

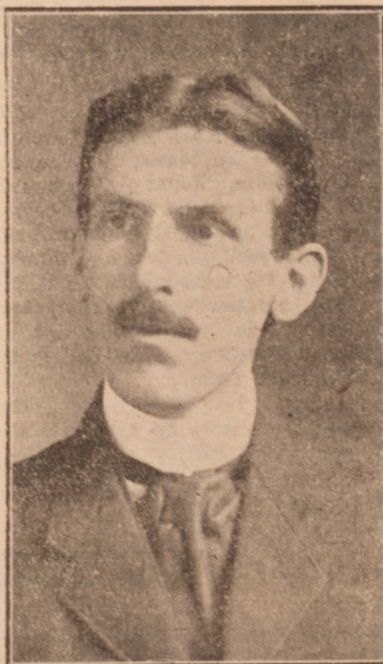
The officers elected for the year were:

Reports were received and other routine business transacted. An important matter was the decision to increase the capital of the company from \$75,000, its present figure, to at least \$125,000. This in rease will be accompanied by corresponding expansion in plant and equipment and in output.

IMPORTANT INDUSTRY.

The John Palmer Company's larrigan factory and tannery is one of the most important industries which Fredericton possesses and one which causes a large amount of money to circulate in this city as well as to advertise Fredericton over the length and breadth of the Dominion. At the present time upwards of one hundred employees are on the pay-roll of the company, and the number is steadily increasing. Last week the sum of one thousand dollars was distributed in wages by the company. The annual output of the factory is valued at \$250,000. As soon in the spring as the weather permits, it is the intention of the company to begin the erection of a new factory building on Victoria street, near Westmorland street. In the new building all the various operations connected with the manufacture of larrigans and shoe-packs will be carried on under one roof. At present, on account of lack of room, that cannot be done.

practically every lumbering and mining district in Canada, as well as in certain parts of the United States, where in spite of a heavy duty, they are largely sold. Palmer's larrigans went into the Yukon shortly after the discovery of the Klondike gold-fields, and at present are sold largely by British Columbia jobbers. Recently the Palmer Company received a large order from Alaska, and with the recent reduction in the United States tariff expects to develop a large trade in the United States.

ENGLAND MAY CARE FOR CONSUMPTIVES

London, Jan. 22--To a letter to Hall Caine, who has been advocating government measures with the object of stamping out consumption, principally through the state taking charge of all consumptives, David Lloyd George, chancellor of the exchequer, makes the interesting announcement that he has already been considering practicability of dealing with this problem in connection with his forthcoming scheme of an alidity insurance.

The chancellor says that the chief difficulty is financial, and that it will be especially hard to estimate the maximum contribution which can be levied upon the workmen. However, he expressed himself as hopeful of doing something to arrest the terrible scourge, "whose livid whelms" are deeply marked on the face of Great Britain.

AN ITALIAN SUIING CONSTRUCTION COMPANY

Toronto, Ont., Jan. 24.--Pietro Quinto, an Italian workman, is suing the Bishop Construction Co., for \$5,000 damages and \$15.75 wages. Quinto claims that while working on a dam at Peterboro in 1903, he fell off a scaffolding, crushing his leg so that manual labor is henceforth impossible. He says that proper safeguards were not provided.

THE GOULD RAILWAY TO BE EXTENDED

Augusta, Me., Jan. 23.--An extension to the Canadian border of the Arcostook Valley railroad, an electric line, is urged in bills presented to the Maine legislature today. R., east from Presque Isle (Me.), to Arcostook Junction (N. B.).
