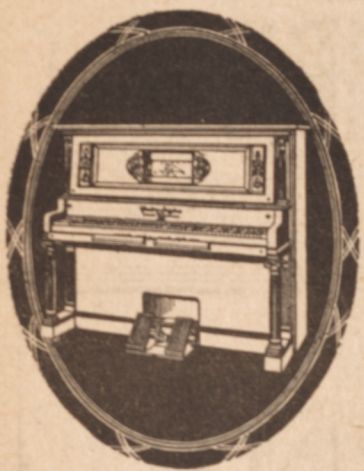

WORK TO START SOON ON GEORGIAN BAY CANAL

Ottawa, Jan. 22.—It is now regarded as a settled fact that this year will see a start on the Georgian Bay Canal. A special estimate of \$3,000,000 allowing for a beginning, has been prepared and it is expected that it will shortly be brought down. Confirmation of the report is indicated in the remarks of Hon. Rodolphe Lemieux at Montreal, and also in statements that have been made by some of the ministers to members for constituencies particularly interested in the work.

The amount proposed as a starter will be quite sufficient for the year, as by the time it is spent the next session will have convened. Then the big expenditure will be made at the two ends—Montreal and the French river.

Whether the route at Montreal will be in front of the city or by the back river is an open question. Each has its advocates, but the latter, it is said, is the cheaper by \$2,000,000.

It is understood that while the work will be done by contract, it will be a government undertaking rather than that of a private company with a bond guarantee. The canal, like the others of the Canadian system, would probably be free.

SUCCESSFUL OPERATION

Victoria Co. News.—An interesting operation for a group of farmers of the Carlingford district, was that of a surgical operation performed by Dr. T. L. Lewis, the well known veterinary, on a horse owned by Miss Everett of Carlingford, last Thursday. The operation consisted of the sewing of a V shaped cut on the horse's flank, 28 inches long requiring 106 stitches of six ply gut and breaking the eyes of seven needles. Two hour's time were consumed in the work. The witnesses were enthusiastic over the neatness and skill with which the most ugly wound that they ever saw was treated.

WIRELESS MESSAGE FROM AEROPLANE

San Francisco, Cal., Jan. 22.—Lieut. Paul Beck, of the United States Signal service, demonstrated today to the army's satisfaction of the practicability of sending wireless messages from a scouting aeroplane to field headquarters.

Flying with Philip Parmelee in a Wright biplane, equipped with a wireless sending instrument and with a wire antennae a hundred feet long trailing from the car. Lieut. Beck, transmitted half a dozen messages to the wireless station on the aviation grounds. The first message was to the Associated Press. It had been prepared in advance by a representative and its text was known only to the writer. Lieut. Beck tucked it in his pocket and did not open the paper until he had reached an altitude of 500 feet.

The airship was at times about two and a half miles from the field, while the officer was finishing communications to the wireless station, and the receiving operator stated that he had no difficulty in reading the message and thought the same could have been sent had the distance been twenty miles.

Toronto, Ont., Jan. 23.—Canada is likely to lose Rev. Dr. Patterson soon again. It is only about nine months ago that he severed his connection with Bethany Presbyterian Church, Philadelphia, to become identified with the Presbyterian Church in Canada as traveling evangelist. It is understood, that he has been approached with a view to accepting a call to the church in Belfast, Ireland, formerly occupied by Rev. Dr. McCaughen who with his wife met a tragic death in a hotel fire recently and he is likely to accept.

Dr. Patterson first became famous in Cooks Church, Toronto, where he caused a furore by his vigorous opposition to the Jesuits estates bill. He built up Cooke's Church from a struggling congregation to the largest Presbyterian Church in Canada.
