Eddie King, touted as another Fred Taylor, who hangs out at Calgary, has been recommended to the Ottawa Club and the locals will get after him at once. He played with the Stettler team, which beat Edmonton for the Fit Reform Cup last winter. King, it is said, was the whole Stettler team in that series. He plays right wing and is a big fellow, weighing somewhere around 180. His Calgary friends wanted him to go to the Wanderers, but Ottawa was tipped off first.

BASEBALL SCORING
RULES MAY BE ALTERED

New York, Dec. 2.—At the next meeting of the two big leagues an attempt will be made to adopt a more complete method of recording the work of pitchers. This is one branch of the scoring rules that certainly needs adjustment. For instance, here is a question, asked by one of the fans, and so far nobody has been able to answer it satisfactorily:

EMINENT LAWYER
TO DEFEND RICHESON

Boston, Mass., Dec. 4.—Mr. John L. Lee, one of the most distinguished lawyers in Virginia, arrived today to prepare for the defence of Rev. Clarence V. T. Richeson, charged with murdering Avis Linnell, of Hyannis, with cyanide of potassium.

Mr. Lee has but little more than a month to complete his case, as the trial is to begin in January. After he had seen Rev. Mr. Richeson on his former visit to the city, he declared that he was convinced that the clergyman was innocent.

Lawyers and others who know Lee declare that he would never have taken the case unless he believed he could secure the acquittal of his client.

Mr. Lee is noted for having cleared three men accused of murder and under sentence of death in his native state only last month. He is an exceptional court room orator, and is very keen in the questioning of witnesses.

Thanksgiving Day he shared in the prison fare and was locked all day in his cell with his thoughts. There was no one to call and cheer him.
