KINRADE MURDER CASE MAY BE REOPENED

Hamilton, Ont., Dec. 27.—It was rumored here yesterday that a private detective agency had asked the crown attorney at Washington a short time ago to request the crown to furnish money to continue the investigation of the Kinrade murder case, as they had discovered some things that might lead to a solution of the mystery.

The local police know nothing of the matter and Crown Attorney Washington said there was no foundation for the story that he had been approached and he declined to further discuss the matter. It is claimed that a private detective, who formerly worked on the case, had been in the city recently and there are some who profess to believe that there is something behind the story.

\$80,000 NECKLACE WAS WORTH BUT \$50

Paris, Dec. 27.—There is a very good reason why the alleged \$80,000 pearl necklace was not buried with Mme. Lantelme. This is the peculiar gem which it was supposed the robbers were after when they broke into the vault in Pere Lachaise cemetery. It turns out now that the former actress possessed no such trinket. She appeared at the theatre one evening wearing a necklace which was of unique design and which was said to be worth \$80,000. It really cost \$50 and was the work of a practically unknown specialist in making near-pearls. She possessed a diamond necklace, however, which was valued at the time of the probate of her estate at \$15,000. She also had other jewels valued at \$20,000.

FINANCIAL and COMMERCIAL

ASBESTOS BONDHOLDERS

The Amalgamation Asbestos bondholders are responding very satisfactorily to the call to have their bonds deposited with one National Trust Company. Bondholders who have not yet sent in their bonds should do so without delay, as it will not only facilitate the committee's operations but will improve the prospects of a beneficial settlement of the bondholders' troubles.

THE NEW YORK MARKET

J. S. Bache & Company say of the market: The speculative tone of the market remains strong, but until the holidays are over decided improvements cannot be expected. It is noted however, that the buying demand is increasing somewhat. Money will undoubtedly be easier after the first of the year, which should help speculation and prices.

BANK COMMERCE HAS THE HABIT

Apologies of the absorption of the Eastern Townships Bank by the Bank of Commerce, it is interesting to note that the Bank of Commerce has been in the "absorption" business for some time.

In January, 1910, the Bank of British Columbia was taken in, the Commerce paying therefor \$2,000,000 in stock and \$312,000 in cash. In May 1903, the Commerce absorbed the Halifax Banking Co., paying \$700,000 in stock and \$6,000 in cash. In June, 1906, the Merchants Bank of Prince Edward Island was absorbed, the Commerce paying therefor \$678,024.

CANADIAN POWER

Canadian Power common was quite strong today, advancing to 47, though subsequently reacting a small fraction.

The bonds were decidedly firmer at 76. It is believed that the negotiations towards bringing the company into the Tramways Company are almost completed.

FOREIGN CRAFT GIVEN RENEWAL

Ottawa, Dec. 26.—Foreign craft will continue to have free access to the coasting trade of Canada for another year at least. An order in council has been made by the government providing that vessels of not less than 1,500 tons, from Italy, Germany, the Netherlands, Sweden, Norway, Austria-Hungary, Denmark, Belgium, Argentina and Japan, shall be admitted to the coasting trade of Canada between Nova Scotia and Quebec on the same terms and conditions as Canadian vessels to the end of 1913.

There has been a relaxation of quarantine regulations against cholera. An order has been made by the director-general of public health that bacteriological examination of passengers from Italy is hereafter to apply only to cholera infected vessels.

MADE BIG PROFIT FROM WATER SERVICE

Moncton, N. B. Dec. 26.—At a meeting of the city council tonight to consider the water and light department reports for the year Mayor Reilly stated the present year had been the most profitable since the city expropriated the works. The net profits amounted to \$21,390.92, with cash on hand of \$44,985. The gross revenue for the year was \$51,527.

City Clerk Magee and Auditor Carter submitted a financial statement in connection with the water department showing that the department really owed the city treasury \$32,298.15. They suggested steps be taken to divert some of the surplus of the water department to reducing the city taxes for ordinary purposes. The council decided to seek legislation carrying out these suggestions.

The main street tunnel constructed by the I. C. R. under the northern railway crossing has been declared ready for traffic and the city council tonight gave the I. C. R. authority to close up the old roadway over the dangerous crossing and divert the night of the big conflagration on traffic through the tunnel.

That natural gas was in the city Main street last week, was the statement made by the city engineer tonight. The council instructed the city engineer to be present at the test of gas pipes before the company turns on its gas for use, in order to see that the safety of citizens is properly safeguarded.
