HEARING RESUMED IN LORIMER CASE

Washington, D.C., Dec. 5.—The United States senate committee, which has been investigating charges of corruption in the election of Senator Lorimer of Illinois, resumed its hearings in this city today. Twelve weeks have been spent in the investigation so far and during that time 130 witnesses have been heard. Practically all of these witnesses were called by attorneys for the committee. A large number are now to be called by Elbridge Haneey, attorney for Senator Lorimer, in an effort to break down the stories previously told on the stand. Senator Lorimer will testify after all other witnesses have been heard. There seems little likelihood that the committee will submit its report to the senate before next February.

Alvah H. Martin who is the Republican national committeeman from Virginia, has been re-elected clerk of the circuit court of Norfolk County.

ORGANIZE TO BREAK TREATY WITH RUSSIA

New York, Dec. 6.—United States senators and representatives, diplomats, educators and prominent men of affairs came to New York today to assist in the formulation of plans for a nation-wide agitation for the abrogation of the treaty of 1832 with Russia because that the country's refusal to honor without discrimination the passports issued by the United States. The Russian authorities have persistently refused to honor passports issued to Jews. As a consequence of this attitude on the part of the Czar's government many Jewish citizens of the United States, among them men of the world-wide prominence as scholars, philanthropists and men of affairs, have been denied the privilege of visiting Russia.

Beginning with a meeting in Carnegie Hall tonight, presided over by Andrew D. White, former ambassador of the United States to Russia, a series of great mass-meetings are to be held in every large city of the country to protest against the attitude of the Russian government on the passport question. Among the prominent men who have given their support to the movement are Andrew Carnegie, Vice President Sherman, Governor Woodrow Wilson, William R. Hearst, Senator Penrose, Senator Penrose of Pennsylvania, Senator O'Gorman of New York, Dr. Charles H. Parkhurst and Bishop David H. Greer.

SCOTLAND GIVES MEN TO THE WORLD

(Montreal Herald)

"If you ask me what it is that Scotland has given to the world, the most satisfactory answer that I can think of is 'Men.' She has enriched the blood of humanity with a singularly virile, wholesome stock. If we look at this continent we see that this stock is continually being absorbed, for unlike the Hebrews, the Scots are not separatists, but readily mingle with other kindred peoples," said Rev. John Lochhead, in the course of the anniversary sermon of St. Andrew's Society, of which he is chaplain, in Melville Church, Westmount, last night.

A large congregation, composed for the most part of members of the two Scottish societies, St. Andrews and Caledonia listened with interest as the preacher gave the Scots credit for special gifts, powers of intellect, well-developed character, and said that the Scot was more independent and democratic than the native of England, who held the palm in regard to law, government and letters.

In the fields of science, philosophy and letters, of government, exploration, colonization, commerce and enterprise, said the preacher, the Scots have contributed out of all proportion to their population.

Analyzing the causes of Scotland's power of character the speaker gave as the leading features: the struggle for independence and the reformation. To the latter he attributed the prevalent spirit of democracy in the Scottish mind.

At the conclusion of the service in the vestry, Sir Montagu Allan, president of the Caledonian Society, thanked the preacher.




