

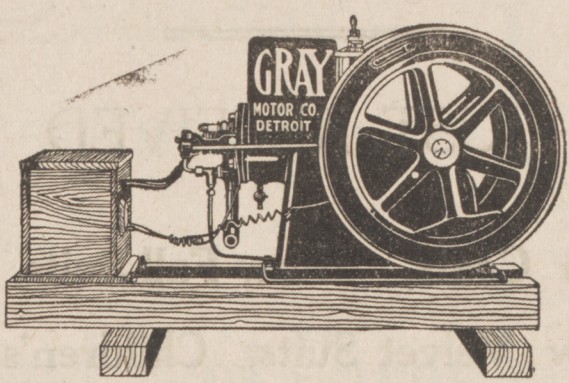

RECIPROCITY WILL HELP HORSE TRADE

Toronto, Aug. 25.—Mr. A. Yeager, the well known horse breeder, has a letter in the Globe replying to that of Mr. Burns, a horse dealer, who opposes reciprocity. Mr. Yeager says that "blocks" of from 1,300 to 1,500 pounds, which brings from \$400 to \$500 a pair in Toronto sell for \$700 to \$800 in Buffalo.

"Then take our drivers," he said, "our misfits, that you can hardly get \$180 or \$150 for, and their board will eat them up before they are sold. The same will bring in Buffalo from \$250 to \$350. I mean delivery grocery, milk wagon, light express and heavy horses. They have the cities, and they want our Canadian misfits. There are thousands looking for them."

"I have been a breeder all my life," Mr. Yeager continues, "and in 1896, 1897 and 1898 I bought and shipped over 1100 horses to Montreal, which was only market. Then they were reshipped to England and the breeder was getting for 1200 pounds and 1400 pounds blocks for eighty dollars apiece. The same king will bring today \$200 to \$250 in the Toronto market and considerably more in Buffalo. But ship them to Liverpool and this price is \$150, which net the breeder \$80 or \$90, by the time he pays his freight and commission, and we could not sell 100 horses in one hundred days at that price. STRICT RULES TO GOVERN BOXING

New York, Aug. 29.—The regulations drawn up by the newly organized State Boxing Commission to govern boxing contests in New York State went into force today. The rules are of the most stringent character and are calculated to place the sport on a higher plane than it has ever been before. Physical fitness of the participants in boxing bouts is to be insisted upon, betting is to be discouraged, liquors must not be sold in places where contests are in progress, and care is to be exercised in the selection of club officials. Sunday exhibitions cannot be held under the new rules and no person under eighteen years of age is to be allowed to participate in any boxing contest. No decisions are to be rendered except in amateur tournaments held under the rules of the Amateur Athletic Union.

Middleton, Conn., Aug. 28.—Railroad men were at work all night clearing up the wreckage of the Valley division express of the New York New Haven and Hartford Railroad which was ditched three and a half miles south of here last night injuring sixty persons.

The railroad authorities say the wreck was due to spreading rails. The train consisted of a locomotive, two baggage and eight passenger coaches. The engine was thrown on its side, into a sand bank and the two baggage cars went down a thirty foot embankment toward the Connecticut River.

The first passenger coach ran into the tender of the locomotive and was badly splintered. The other cars were thrown in all directions.
