#### SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY PERSON who is the sole head of a family, or any male over eigh teen years old, may homstead a quarter section of available Dominon land in Manitoba, Saskatchewar or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency. on certain conditions, by father.

Duties-Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least eighty acres, solely owned and occupied by Pacific him or by his father, mother, son. daughter, brother or sister.
