HON. MR. GRAHAM MAY HAVE TO FIGHT

Ottawa, Dec. 7.—Thomas A. Low, M.P., for South Renfrew, has forwarded his resignation to the Speaker of the House of Commons, in conformity with the agreement made between the two political parties in South Renfrew, by which T. W. McGarry was given an election by acclamation to the Ontario legislature on the understanding that Hon. George P. Graham would be allowed to be elected by acclamation to the Commons.

The Conservative managers in Ottawa have repudiated such an arrangement, but as the Conservative executive of the riding has pledged its word, it is not believed that either Hon. J. D. Reid or Hon. Frank Cochrane will have influence enough to cause them to go back on their compact.

The Speaker will this afternoon inform the House that he has issued his warrant for a new election, and the date therefore will be fixed by the government. The Liberals have confidence that the arrangement will be lived up to, but on the other hand prominent Conservatives here assert that there will be a contest and that they will spare no efforts to defeat Mr. Graham.

Mr. Lowe, who was first elected in 1908 by a majority of 680, was re-elected in September last by a majority of 619, after one of the most strenuous campaigns in the history of the riding.

Hon. G. P. Graham, who is in Ottawa today, will go to Renfrew in a day or two and prepare for the campaign, if campaign there is to be.

MORE CAPITAL FOR BANKS.

Mr. R. B. Angus, at the Bank of Montreal meeting, gave as one of the reasons for the new \$1,500,000 stock issue, the fact that the bank has reached the legal limit of its circulation.

So have many of the other banks reached the limit, and some sixteen of them took advantage of the emergency currency last month.

Mr. John Knight, in a carefully compiled statement on the currency question, points out the circulation of all banks has increased some \$50,000,000 since 1902, while the paid-up capital in the same time has increased only \$32,000,000.

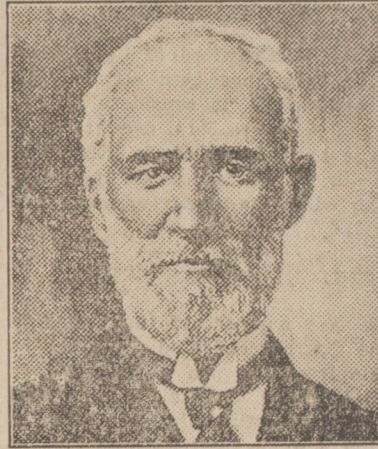
The only solution is for the banks to keep on increasing their capital.
