

General Hull was later summoned to a court martial, which found him guilty of cowardice and sentenced him to death. The sentence of death was not executed but he was dropped from the army rolls. In the course of time General Hull's conduct met with vindication in the minds of the people, and much of the blame for the surrender was laid upon the war department for its failure to make dequate preparations for carrying n the war.
