#### HOURS OF SLEEP

Scientist Says Ten Hours at Least Absolutely Necessary

Hens That Hatch Fish

As is generally known, a big quantity of fish spawn is annually lost. To avoid this fish-rearers in China carefully collect spawn from the surface of the water, and when they have secured a sufficient quantity they have a number of hens' eggs, the contents of which have been carefully empiled through a small aperture, and refill the shells with th spawn. The holes are then sealed up and the eggs put under broody hens. The hens are allowed to incubate the eggs for a certain number of days, when the eggs are again broken and their contents put into water that has heen previously warmed by the sun.
