Simply rippin!

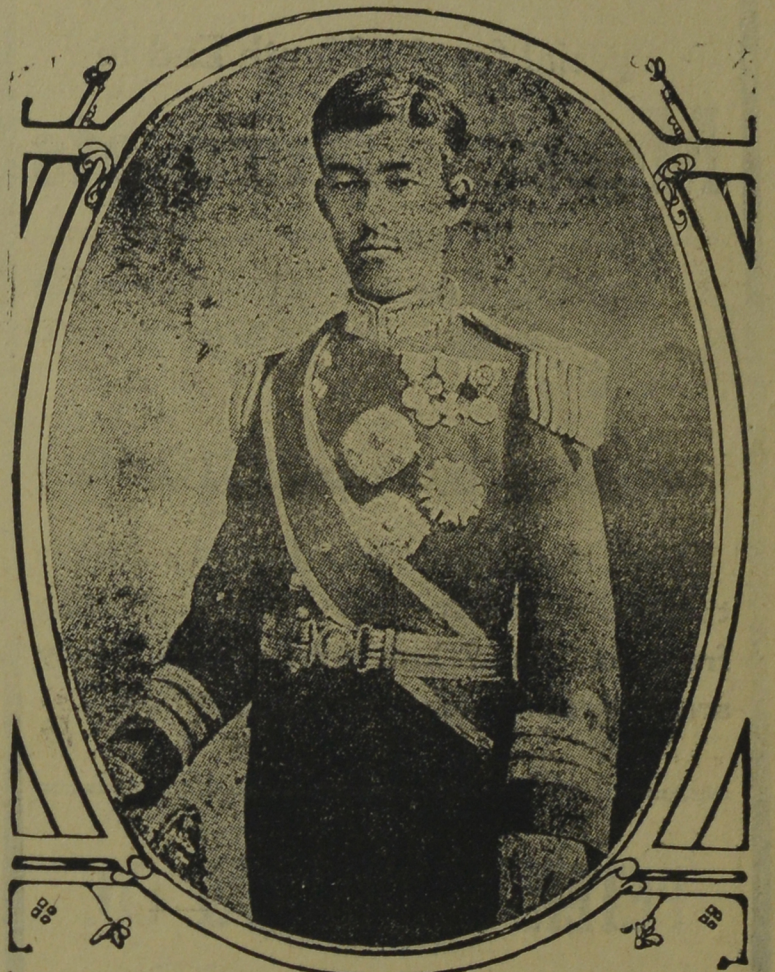

### EMPEROR OF JAPAN



Tokio, Dec. 25--The Imperial Diet was dissolved today.  
The House of Representatives rejected the army expansion proposed  
by the government. This led to the dissolution of the House.  
The closing session of the House was dramatic in the extreme. The  
debate extended all through the day and on into the night. The House  
was unable to compose its differences and there was no sign that the de-  
bate was approaching its end, when, shortly before ten o'clock, it was  
announced that Emperor Yoshitomi had exercised his royal prerogative,  
dissolving the Diet.
