A DISGRACE TO CANADA

The shocking revelations of graft being made before the royal commission at St. John are attracting the attention of newspapers all over Canada. It will be remembered that ust before the royal commission got settled down to work Premier Flemming handed out an interview to The Montreal Star in which he assured our Liberal-Conservative friends throughout Canada that there was not one word of truth in the allegations of graft made against him. Those who accepted the premier's assurance must have been painfully supprised and shocked at the disclosures which have been made from day to day. Only the blindest politician partizan will attempt to say today that the charges preferred by Mr. Dugal have not been proved right up to the hilt.

"THE TERRIBLE REVELATIONS OFFICIAL GRAFT IN NEW BRUNSWICK ARE A DISGRACE NOT ONLY TO THAT PROVINCE, BUT TO ALL CANADA. 


