of Mirs Bay, a pirate stronghold. Through marine glasses the crew of the Etienne could see a crowd of me swarming like ants down the shore at sunset and preparing to laung boats. The Chinese carried spear and they propelled their boats wit long sweeps. There was one bit of ade, which is a short gun of large

calibre, useful only at close range. The carronade was fired once, in th hope of bringing assistance, then re loaded and preparations made to re ceive the pirates. On they swept in three big boats, black in the sunse glow, and yelling loudly. The pirates were naked to the waist. The crew of the Ttienne were served with rifles and cutlasses, and three barrels of ottled beer which had been senboard the ship just before it sailed is a gift to the officers, were brought on deck. 'he beer was emptied inte tubs on deck and the bottles smashed The deck was then strewn with broke glass.

The pirate ships as they approached fired several times, and one 12-pounc shot struck the main mast of the Etienne. When they were within 10 yards the carronade of the European ship was discharged and there wa of the vessels. The short cannon wa point blank into its bows. Then th Stienne's crew, very small in com parison with the number of the pirates warmed into the rigging in order to cick off the Chinese with more ease As the barefooted Chinamen swarm d upon the deck of the Etienne the vere thrown into the greatest co: usion by the broken glass and leaper owling about the deck nursing their younded feet, while the crew aloft oured down an effective fire upon hem. But it was not long before the irates began to clamber up the r'g ging. With rifles and revolvers the Europeans picked them off. "They fell like overripe fruit into the sea. says the author. But there were plenty more waiting to take the places of those who fell. Eventually, how ever, the pirates were repulsed and forced to flee after heavy loss in the sharp sea battle.
