## BOTTOM OF LAKE PAVED WITH IRON ORE

Sawtooth Reef In Stormy Superior  
Sewn With Many Thousands of  
Tons of the Mineral

A veritable open pit iron mine of  
immense richness lies off the shores  
of Keweenaw Point, which juts out  
into Lake Superior from the southern  
shore a distance of fifty miles. Saw-  
tooth Reef, off Keweenaw Point a  
mile, and throwing its cruel points up  
from a hundred fathoms of water to  
within twenty feet of the surface, has  
caught and held many ships that have  
lost their course in thick fogs on dark  
nights or have gone ashore because  
of deviations of the compass. The  
steamer George S. Baker of the Ste-  
Trust fleet, which was picked up at  
Sawtooth Reef during a dense fog re-  
cently, went on the rocks because  
of the compass "running away." The  
same was true in the case of the  
Moreland, which was destroyed at  
Sawtooth Reef three years ago, a  
though the Moreland went on the  
rocks during a clear, cloudless, an-  
fogless night, according to res-  
ident of Eagle River, who sat on the porch  
of their homes and watched the  
ship swing in onto the reef. Whether  
it is the jettisoned cargoes of iron or  
that cause this deviation of the com-  
pass cannot be said.

From the ill-fated Moreland, which  
was just off Eagle River on her maiden  
trip, nearly 12,000 tons of ore were  
jettisoned. A cargo of 10,500 tons  
was thrown overboard from the hold  
of the George S. Baker. A half-dozen  
other ships which have stranded along  
the Keweenaw coast and north shore  
have contributed large cargoes. The  
steamer Waldo gave 5,000 tons of ore  
toward this "under the lake" mine at  
Gull Rock, ten miles off the point. A  
score of wooden ships which have  
gone down around the point in twenty  
years or so have lost their cargoes  
there. It is estimated that lying loose  
in the waters of Superior about the  
shores of Keweenaw are from 100,000  
to 150,000 tons of perfectly good iron  
ore, all to be had for the taking. The  
copper peninsula is rusted, along its  
shores, from the wastings of the jet-  
tisoned cargoes of iron ore.

## STRANGE DREAMS AND THEIR PORTENTS


Do People of the Present Age Still  
Believe in the Supernatural?  
—It Would Seem So

Most people have, deep down in  
their natures, a private and uncon-  
fessed faith in dreams, premonitions,  
forebodings, says the Toronto Star.  
Some hard-headed business men will  
not start on an important journey nor  
embark on a big business venture on a  
Friday, although they do not actually  
say so, and you may do business with  
them for years without finding it out.  
They contrive matters so that it is  
never necessary to admit that they  
have a fear of Friday. It would be  
too absurd a thing to admit, and they  
do not actually confess it to them-  
selves. Or if they ever admit it to  
themselves or to their closest friends  
they speak of it, not as a real super-  
stition, but as a humorous little oddity  
which interests and amuses them. The  
present age is one of levity, but the  
truth is that mankind is strongly pre-  
disposed towards superstition and to  
a belief in the supernatural.

Strange stories are told in connec-  
tion with the loss of the Empress of  
Ireland. People had dreams, pre-  
monitions, and forebodings. We have  
no wish to express a doubt as to the  
truthfulness of anybody who relates  
an experience of this kind. In fact,  
we see no reason for doubting the  
truth of all the evidence produced,  
but we see no reason for assuming  
that these dreams and forebodings  
were a bit different from what they  
would have been if the Empress of  
Ireland had enjoyed a prosperous  
voyage. What we mean to say is that  
when a thousand people are about  
to make a journey by sea, there will  
be among them, and among their  
relatives, many who will have dreams  
and forebodings, which will possess  
significance if a shipwreck occurs, but  
which will possess no significance at  
all and will never be heard of if the  
journey is a happy one.

There is the story of the ship's cat,  
which, although it had kittens on  
board, ran away, and although brought  
back, escaped again and did not sail  
on the Empress. This story will pass  
into tradition. About it we would say  
that it needs to be verified. Even if  
verified, we would expect to find the  
explanation in the life and affairs of  
the cat, rather than in any mys-  
terious fore-knowledge or foreboding  
of the animal that in a future fog at  
sea the captains of two ships would  
misunderstand each other and cause  
a disaster.

ber of men, who, for its sake, must  
be humbled and reduced to imperfect
