PURITY IN ELECTIONS

(Continued from page one.)

With one exception the other speakers in the debate followed the same impartial course. The one exception was A. C. Boyce of Algoma, who made an unpleasant and unnecessary attack upon the sincerity of Mr. MacLean. Perhaps by way of rebuke to Mr. Boyce, Premier Borden in his own speech a little later commended Mr. MacLean's moderation and firmness.

Hon. Dr. Doherty laid stress upon the necessity of distinguishing between the candidate who endeavors to carry on an honest campaign but through his agents may be guilty of some minor offenses, and the candidate whose election is won by gross corruption.

It was noteworthy, however, that the premier failed to make any reference to campaign contributions and publicity as to expenditures or to the appointment of a public prosecuting officer for election cases. The omission was noteworthy because of the importance of the importance placed upon these points by Mr. Borden, when he was in opposition, and the emphasis given them today by Mr. MacLean.

Referring to Mr. Boyce's partizan speech, Sir Wilfrid Laurier said that the technique argument was the favorite of the government men.

"They say to us," he went on, "should have amended the law."

"Hear, hear," called several government members.

"Hear, hear, my friends say," retorted Sir Wilfrid. "Then why have they not amended the law? In opposition they said that if they were in power they would reform conditions. They have been two years in office, but there has been nothing done. They question the sincerity of Mr. MacLean. What shall we say of the sincerity of the government which has done nothing?"

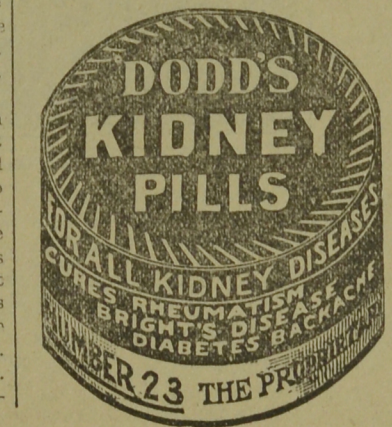

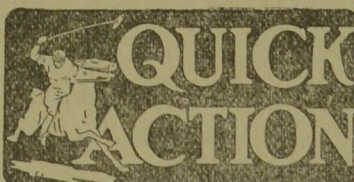
