GERMANS NOW ADVANCING TOWARD CITY OF OSTEND

(Continued from page one.)

Botha will lose no time in taking measures to squelch Maritz and his followers.

"Hertzog, leader of the Dutch opposition in the House, has nothing to do with the affair, and one result of Maritz will be to drive waverers into Botha's ranks and give a great stimulus to recruiting. Botha can get 10,000 men to Upton, where Maritz is, in a very short time, and, if I do not mistake the Boers of the Black Veldt, they will not only sympathize with Maritz, but will give him the shortest shrift."

HAVE "BIG SURPRISE"

London, Wednesday, Oct. 14—A despatch from Copenhagen to the Daily News, says: "What is the big surprise the Germans have for England, which they repeatedly talk about? Copenhagen is full of rumors, purporting to come from German officers in private letters and despatches. The Kiel Canal is again closed to neutral ships and the 'big surprise' rumors are received by petty influential and reliable persons in private despatches from Kiel, although it is difficult to understand how they have passed the censor."

"The reports say that the Germans are experimenting with new heavy guns fixed on a dreadnought, and that the canal is closed for the purpose of conducting firing practice."

BELGIAN REFUGEES

London, Oct. 13—The Chronicle correspondent at Rosendaal says that when it became known that the Germans were about to occupy Ghent the whole population, some 20,000 persons, fled to Sas Van Ghent, in Dutch territory, where there have been some remarkable scenes.

"Wealthy people," he says, arrived in their carriages and motor cars with all the valuables they could save. The poor came afoot and on cycles, many pushing wheel barrows, and all staggering under the weight of bundles of household goods. It is a serious position for Sas Van Ghent, already overcrowded, and food must be rushed there from distant parts of Holland as the towns near it are in the same plight, being overrun with armies or refugees."

The Morning Post correspondent says: "Thousands of Belgian refugees have been received with the utmost sympathy in Holland, everyone considering it an honor to help the poor people."

The Frankfurter Zeitung insinuates that the Dutch though making good profit out of the well-to-do refugees are allowing the poor ones to starve. Intense indignation has been caused here by this allegation.

PARIS

Paris, Oct. 13—The official communication issued by the French war department tonight says:

"With the exception of an advance of some importance in the vicinity of Berry-Au-Bac (on the centre) there is nothing to report."

PETROGRAD

London, Oct. 11—It is officially announced at Petrograd that the siege of Przemysl is progressing, according to a despatch to Reuter's Telegram Company from the Russian capital. The Russian artillery is rapidly destroying the forts, which, however, continue an energetic resistance.

The Przemysl garrison, it is further announced, does not exceed 30,000 men.

Paris, Oct. 14—The following official communication given out Tuesday night in Petrograd, has been received here by the Havas Agency:

"Operations continue to develop on our front, which extends from the region of Warsaw, along the Rivers Vistula and San, to Przemysl and further south as far as the River Dniester."

"The situation in Eastern Prussia remains unchanged."

BERLIN

Berlin, Oct. 13 via Amsterdam and London—Heavy fighting continues in the Argonne, two chains of hills in Northeastern France, according to an official statement received here today from the German general headquarters, under date of October 13. Violent attacks made by the enemy east of Soissons have been repulsed, it is said. The communication follows:

"There is no important news from the western war theatre. Violent attacks made by the enemy east of Soissons have been repulsed. Heavy fighting continues in the Argonne. Our troops are moving forward through dense underwood is very difficult ground with stage trains for use against the fortifications. The French troops offer obstinate resistance, firing from trees where machine guns are posted."

Beside rifle pits, which are arranged in tiers, they have built strong

points of support."

The statement contradicts news given out by French army authorities regarding success met with by the allies in the Woivre region, and denies other reports. It continues:

"All the French attacks at St. Mihiel have been repulsed. Etain (twelve miles northeast of Verdun) remains in our possession."

"Belgian officers who are interned in Holland estimate that about 20,000 Belgian soldiers are still in Antwerp as prisoners."

"The Germans, as soon as they entered Antwerp took possession of all the fire engines in the city, commenced extinguishing the fires."

THE CONSUL LEAVES.

Washington, Oct. 13—The British consul at Ostend has placed his interests in the hands of the American consulate and will leave tomorrow, the occupation of the city by the Germans being expected. Consular despatches to the state department said that telegraph and telephone communication with Ghent from Ostend had been cut and that Bruges already was in the hands of the Germans.

Later advices from the American consul, at Ostend, however, said communication by telephone with Bruges had been established and that the town still was held by the Allies. London, Oct. 13—A correspondent of the 'Daily Mail' tells of Germany's latest plan to invade England.

The information was given him, he says, in all seriousness, by persons who say it is implicitly believed in Berlin.

The proposal to take Calais and then construct pontoons six and a half miles into the English channel. On these will be planted seven-inch siege guns is bombarded Dover, fifteen or sixteen miles away.

Zeppelins will appear in force and complete the destruction which the guns have left undone. The German fleet is to assist in some way not yet explained.
