

MARVELOUS INSTINCT OF WILD ANIMALS

New Method of Study and Experiment Ing Used by Nature Students

The French possess a curious institution in the form of an institute of zoological psychology es'ablished tn a farm near Paris. This station comprises meadows and barnwards, a scend to the bottom of the pond. stocked with fish. Then, too, there are spacious buildings, including modern stables, a riding school, stalls for isolating animales under specia observation, an aquarium and a laboratory. A dovecote is placed upon the coof of the main building.

As evidening the desire of th French naturalists to study the babit ditions, it may be mentioned th complete diving apparatus has bee provided in which observers may d scend to tre bottom of the pond There they may remain for hours until the fish become accustomed to their presence, and follow their natural impulses in playing and feed ing. The under-water student thu is enabled to note their habits at firs. hand.






Italians Like Garters


