DENVER TO HAVE BIG RACE MEETING

Denver, Colo., June 12—Everything has been placed in readiness at Overland Park for the nineteen-day mixed harness and running meeting, which will have its opening there tomorrow. The meeting will be held under the auspices of the Denver Fair and Racing Association and will be the first to be conducted under the control and supervision of the Colorado State racing commission, which was created by legislative enactment last year. The big feature of the meeting will be a \$2,000 stake for a free-for-all pace, the largest stake ever offered for a race in the Rocky Mountain region.

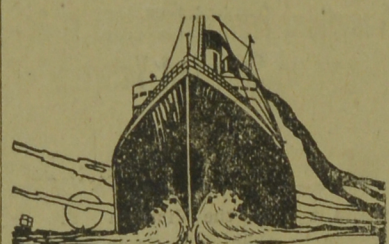
