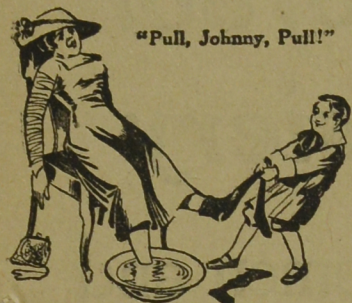

LIBERALS POKE FUN AT PEERS AND PLUOCRATS

London, March 16.—Liberals are poking fun at Friday night's gathering in the Ritz Hotel, at which ninety peers and plutocrats dined with the most lavish sumptuousness. The speakers declared their intention to die in the last ditch in the defence of Ulster, and presented Sir Edward Carson with a gorgeous sword by way of complement to the blackthorn given him a year ago.

It is pointed out that there is no need as yet to use a blackthorn, and there is as little use to be found for the sword, and the whole affair is looked upon as unwise and theatrical, on the eve of Mr. Asquith's promise of a further statement on Monday, which is thought to justify the suspicion that the situation is not so serious as represented in general.

There is a general impression that the Government will not make further concessions, recognizing that those already offered have satisfied no section of the Nationalist or Unionist parties, or Ireland itself.

It is most probable that further concessions would alienate the radical section of the Government's supporters in Great Britain, where the feeling of unrest is unmistakable. The best reason is believed to be given in an inspired editorial in the Westminster Gazette of Saturday. It says:—

"If the Unionists do not get an immediate guarantee of permanent and indefinite exclusion they will refuse to lay down their arms we are told. Such a guarantee cannot be given them. No one in the present Parliament can prevent future parliaments from doing what they will. If this were the real test, Unionists will have to remain in their trenches until the Liberal Home Rulers are destroyed from off the face of the earth, but the appeal to force against Parliament is a vital matter. When Unionists reflect upon what it means and must mean to the Government, we hope that they will get their argument on a more practical basis."

TRAMP STEAMERS

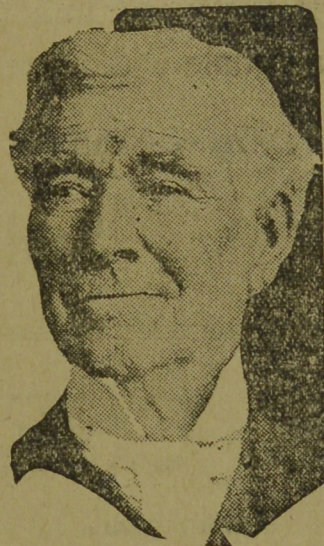
They Are So-called Because They Are the Wanderers of the Ocean

A "tramp" steamer is a "tramp" because she wanders the world over, carrying the most advantageous cargo she can procure and proceeding to any port, no matter how unfamiliar and remote, to which her manifest takes her.

She is not a "tramp," explains Harper's Magazine, because she goes about in tatters and poverty. Quite the contrary is true. There are great tramp lines immensely wealthy and powerful, and the ships that fly these flags are modern in every respect, equipped with wireless, of vast tonnage, and most comfortably appointed in respect to officers' quarters. When his vessel lies in port the tramp captain appears to the envious longshore onlooker to live a life of the most agreeable sort.

As a general rule, however, the captain himself holds his occupation in no such high regard. Tramp captains may gratify their desire for romance, it is true, but only in a limited way, after all; and their prospect for material prosperity is of the smallest. The cash return is little enough; for all the responsibility assumed, the rich cargo and lives carried through months of anxious weather, of gales and fogs at sea, of lonely and monotonous wastes, the wage isn't much greater than a commonplace bookkeeper may earn ashore.

The pay of a junior officer aboard a tramp steamer would outrage the feelings of an alert office boy; the pay of a first mate would shock a bank clerk. But once a first-class officer becomes a captain, his pay is practically doubled. If his owners possess no other ship than his the chance for advancement is extremely slight; but if he is in the service of one of the great freighting lines, his prospect at the best is that of the newest ship at a wage of \$1,500 a year. The next move in fortune of the tramp captain is to the command of a mail steamer. Having obtained this eminence in the service of one of the most considerable trans-Atlantic lines, he is paid no less than \$2,000 a year, and possibly as much as \$4,000 or \$5,000. It is the ultimately sought-for job.

WORK DONE BY A WATCH

The work a watch will do in ten years is surprising. In that time, which includes two leap years, and consequently a total of 3,652 days, the hour hand has made 7,304 and the minute hand 87,313 revolutions. The end of an average minute hand travels over 10,820 yards—over six miles. The second hand has made 5,258,330 revolutions, and its extremity has traversed on the dial a distance of upwards of 123 miles. The escape wheel has made 52,583,800 revolutions, and, as it has fifteen teeth, it has come 788,823,000 times in contact with each pallet. The balance has made 1,577,644,000 vibrations, and any point on the outside of the rim has covered a distance of about 50,000 miles, and that is equal to twice the circumference of the earth.
