

speed is changed to five miles per hour, and the machine is propelled by the regular traction method, the track pinion being entirely released. This change is effected by manuallyoperated clutches located in the gear mechanism in connection with a lever in each cab similar to a steam loco motive. The locomotive is driven by two 75 horse-power totally inclosed motors of the mill type, one being direct connected through reduction to each axle.

#### HOW DO YOU SLEEP
