CANNOT SERVE
TWO MASTERS

St. John & Quebec Railway Says
Ald. McKnight's Civic Duties Must
Not Interfere With His Work
On Construction

Ald. George McKnight who was elected for Kings Ward at Monday's Civic election may be called upon to choose between aldermanic duties and those of his occupation as engineer on construction of the St. John & Quebec Railway at Oranochto. Ald. McKnight was not sworn in yesterday, with the other members of the City Council being out of the city, attending to his duties. In the future, according to the statement of Chief Engineer Ross Thompson of the Saint John & Quebec Railway his aldermanic duties must not conflict with those in connection with the railway. If he can so arrange matters that they will not there will be no complaint from the railway. If not he must choose between the two.

"We were not consulted when Mr. McKnight was nominated" said Chief Engineer Thompson to the Mail today. "We should have been but as a matter of fact did not know of his nomination until the day after the nominations closed. Now that he is elected the company has no desire to put him or the City Council to inconvenience by demanding his resignation as it is thought that such action would be hardly fair. TWO SCOTT ACT

RAIDS MADE BY
CITY POLICE

Lorne Hotel Searched Last Night,
City Hotel This Morning---Quantities of Liquor Found at
Each Place

A raid under a Canada Temperance Act warrant was made by the city police last night and another this morning. On both raids the police secured liquor and cases in the police court against the proprietors of the hotels raided will follow.

The Lorne Hotel, Regent street, was raided last night at about seven o'clock. Detective Roberts, Sergt. Duncan, Policemen Marshall, Hughes and Saunders made the raid. The premises of the hotel were thoroughly searched and three baskets of bottled liquor of various kinds were found in the bar-room. The value is estimated at about fifty dollars.

This morning the City Hotel, Queen street West, was raided. Detective Roberts and Policemen Marshall made the search. About fifty dollars worth of liquor of various kinds was found. The search included the entire premises. The liquor was found in the bar-room.

Chief of Police McCollom stated this morning that he could say nothing yet about the cases which would be brought against the hotel-men as a result of the raid.

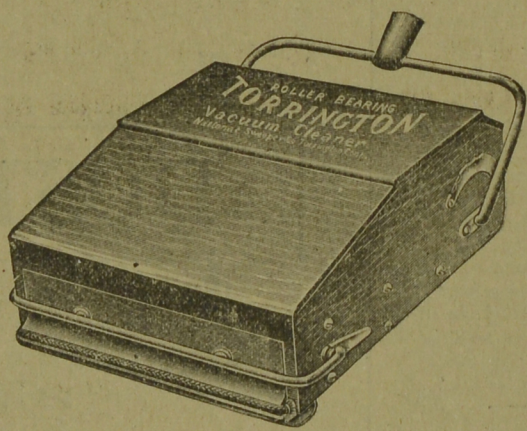

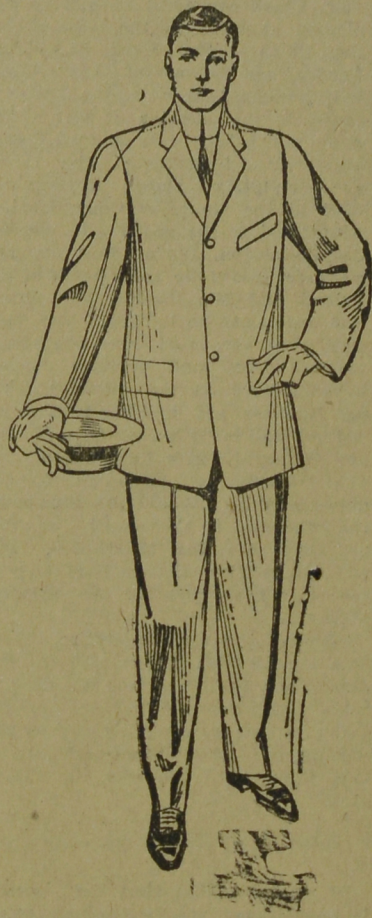
