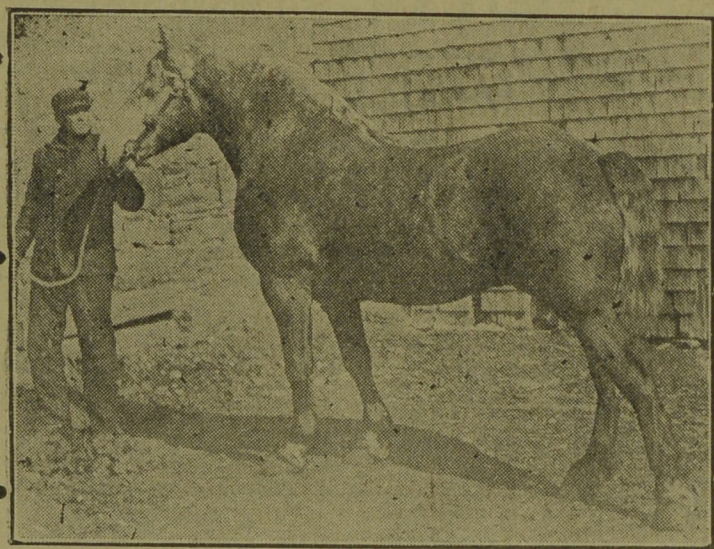

Chicago, April 10—Catcher Clements of the St. Louis Americans probably will join the Pittsburg Federals it was announced today. Clements called at Federal League headquarters today and was sent on to Pittsburg.

According to "Kid" Gleason, the White Sox Third Baseman Harry Lord is going in midseason form, and so far has had no trouble with his throwing arm.

**St. John and Halifax Clubs Will Get no Receipts  
at Moncton or Pictou County Towns--Must Depend on Home Games to Make the Thing go**

(St. John Telegraph.)

The formation of the Maritime Baseball League is now almost a certainty and it lies with the Halifax promoters to put their stamp of approval on the agreement reached during the league meeting in New Glasgow. Although this agreement calls for some concessions to the Pictou County and Moncton teams that will come hard on the Halifax and St. John clubs, the St. John club owners, in order to perpetuate the game in this section and to make the territory interested derive the advertising benefits from it that has been received in the past, decided that they were willing to concede something to the clubs in Moncton and Pictou County.

The agreement reached at the New Glasgow meeting should go into the other two towns in the circuit and play games there without receiving anything from the gate receipts. On the other hand, the Moncton and Pictou County teams would play in St. John and the local club would share in the game with them, forty per cent. going to the visitors. In this way St. John and Halifax will have to depend on their home games and games with each other to make the league go, which will mean that the St. John club will be up against a proposition that they were never forced to accept before.

**AGREEMENT SIGNED.**

The agreement to go through the season on these conditions was signed by the delegates from Moncton and

Pictou County without exception, while the St. John and Halifax representatives signed subject to the approval of the owners of these two clubs. There is no doubt in the world that the league is a sure thing should Halifax backers approve of the agreement. N. W. Mason, who signed the agreement on the part of the Pictou County Club, and William McMullen, who acted for Moncton, are known throughout the country as thoroughly upright and competent business men, as well as being leaders in most all branches of sport and can be relied upon to go on with the formation of the league, just as soon as Halifax sees its way clear to go in with the other teams and carry the league through the season.

**AT NEW GLASGOW.**

The league meeting opened in New Glasgow on Friday afternoon at three o'clock and went away into the wee sma' hours of Saturday morning, but was resumed again Saturday morning after a few hours' rest and the agreement was reached.
