UNUSUAL CIRCUMSTANCES.

The seizure of City Clerk McCready took place under most unusual circumstances. He was reading the oath of office to Ald. George McKnight, who was being sworn in by Mayor Mitchell, when it was noticed that he was ill. The mayor told him to sit down. Shortly afterward Mr. McCready gathered together his papers and entered the committee-room, where the City Council was sitting. After a very small amount of business had been done it was observed that he had difficulty in speaking and in collecting his thoughts. It was then decided that the meeting would be adjourned till Tuesday next and that the city clerk be sent to his home. City Marshal Roberts accompanied Mr. McCready but before his home was reached the city clerk began to lose control of his limbs.

NOT THOUGHT SERIOUS.

There was a very large attendance of citizens at the meeting of the City Council last night on account of the nature of the business to come before that body. The city clerk had complained of a severe tooth-ache, the pain of which seemed to spread to other parts of his body. On that account his condition at first was not thought serious. During the afternoon he had suffered some pain and had visited a dentist on account of a distressing tooth.

CONDITION IS SERIOUS.

Today grave apprehension is felt on account of the city clerk's condition. The city business is seriously interfered with as a result of Mr. McCready's sickness. He is well-known throughout the province on account of his position as a barrister and also on account of his connection with municipal affairs. He is honorary secretary-treasurer of the New Brunswick Union of Municipalities and past president of the Canadian Union of Municipalities.

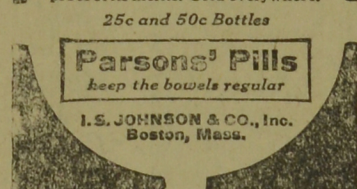
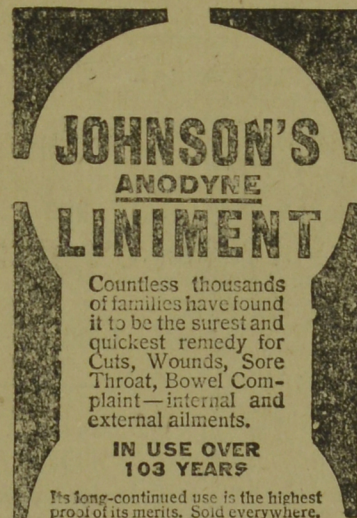
