## HOW B. FRANKLIN SMITH STRIPPED THE RESERVE

Carleton County "Also Ran" Was Given the Right to cut Burnt Timber on the Tobique and Grossly Abused the Privilege—"Lo, the Poor Indian", Who was an Accessory got Thirty Days in Jail

Ottawa, March 19—A most remarkable piece of political intrigue and partizanship has been disclosed in a return brought down in the House of Commons by Mr. B. F. Smith, the Conservative candidate in Carleton county, who planned, and pretty nearly succeeded, in stripping the Tobique Indian Reserve of all the lumber of any value thereon.

In January, 1913, Mr. Smith started the movement by opening up correspondence personally and through the Indian agent, S. P. Waite, and

the department at Ottawa, and on February 11th appears a letter from Mr. Smith, addressed to Dr. Roche, minister of the interior, in which we find this illuminating statement:

"I understand that your department is considering the advisability of allowing the green and burnt timber on the Indian reserve south of the Tobique River to be let either by license or by tender or that perhaps, you would consider a cash offer for the burnt timber south of the Tobique."

"I desire to say that this is situated so that it will be better for me to get it in connection with my mill than it would for anyone else."

The result of these communications was that Mr. Smith got the right to cut all the burnt timber to the south of the Tobique River. The final letter being dated May 8th, 1913, ran as follows:

"Referring to your recent interview at the department, concerning the offer for burnt timber on the Tobique reserve, south side of the river, I have to inform you that your offer of \$1.25 per M. feet, B.M., free of dues has been accepted on the conditions that no green or partly green trees shall be cut and that sworn returns of measurements shall be furnished each season during the three years allowed for its removal, by an authorized scaler, cutter or surveyor

## HOUSE COMMITTEES RECOMMEND BILLS

The Legislative Committee on Corporations met this morning and elected Mr. Slipp chairman. The committee decided to recommend the bill relating to the Albert Manufacturing Company, with amendments, providing that the proceeds from the sale of bonds to be issued can only be used for the replacement of the property of the company which has been destroyed. The committee also decided to recommend the bills incorporating the Carpenter Public Hall Company, correcting a clerical error in the bill incorporating the New Brunswick Hydro-Electric Company, and to give the Fredericton Gaslight Company power to extend their lines from this city to the Parish of St. Mary's.

The Law Committee of the Legislature met this morning and decided to recommend the bill from St. John to amend the Municipalities Act. A provision was made whereby assessors must file the voters' list with the parish clerk within ten days after the completing of the rolls. The Municipal Council of St. John was given authority to make an allowance for councillors not to exceed one hundred dollars per annum in lieu of mileage and other perquisites. Provision was also made for the appointment of a fourth assessor in the Parish of Lancaster. The committee also took up consideration of the bill regarding the extension of the St. John Street Railway Company and confirmed the agreement therein except where it removed control of fares, etc., from the Public Utilities Commission. This bill was under consideration when the committee adjourned.

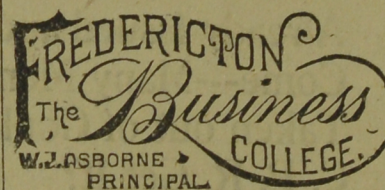

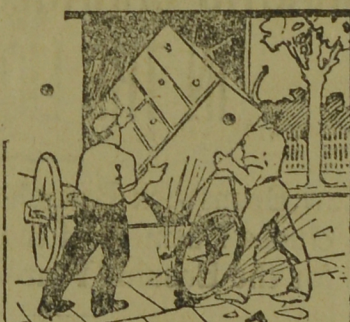
