Chief Game Warden O'Leary, who has held office one year and now regards himself as an authority on big game, wants the government to amend the game law so that the hunting season will open on October 1st instead of on September.15th as at present. His recommendation is scarcely consistent with the demand of the farmers, who blaim that moose and deer have become so plentiful as to be a menace to their crops. For their own protection they have asked that they be given the privilege of shooting these animals during close season. 
