RECREATING GERMANS LEFT THREATS BEHIND

The following is a translation of a proclamation that has been found in a French village, left behind by the Germans in their retreat.

PROCLAMATION TO INHABITANTS!

We make war only against the enemy's armies and not against the inhabitants. In spite of that, the German troops have attacked in great numbers by people who do not belong to the army. They have committed acts of the most shameful cruelty, not only against our troops but against our wounded and doctors protected by the Red Cross.

To prevent these brutalities in future I order

(1) Every person who does not belong to the army and who is found with weapons in his hand will be shot immediately; he will be considered as outside the law of nations.

(2) Every weapon, gun, pistol, revolver, sabre, dagger etc., as well as every kind of explosive, must be given up immediately by the Mayor of the village or town to the commandant of the German troops.

If a single weapon be found in no matter what house, or any act of hostility whatever be committed against our troops, transports, telegraph lines or railways, or if anyone gives any shelter to armed civilians, the guilty persons and the hostages arrested in each village will be shot without pity.

Moreover, all the inhabitants of the district in question will be driven out, and the villages, and even towns, will be demolished and burnt down. If this happens on the line of communication between two districts both districts will be treated exactly alike.

I expect that the mayors, as well as the inhabitants, will ensure by their care and watchfulness and safety of our troops, as well as their own safety.

If they do not, the above-mentioned measures will be put into force with all their rigour.

CLERGYMAN'S STORY WAS A FRAME-UP

London, Ont., Oct. 10.—Rev. Isaac Wilson, pastor of Marble Memorial Methodist Church of Milan, Mich., who told a sensational story last night alleging to have been held up and robbed, now admits that he invented the story. Wilson was found in an alleyway near the Glegg House on York street with knife gashes in his neck, and was taken to a relative's and a doctor was called in. Even today Wilson kept up the story and allowed himself to be photographed by a local paper.

His claim was a reflection on London's good name, but tonight there is no longer any mystery about the alleged real estate deal by which he claimed he secured \$4,500 and later had it stolen, for Detective Egleton has succeeded in getting the Michigan clergyman's signed confession that he invented the yarn on account of financial embarrassment. One of the clues was found in his pocket, being several bogus cheques he had torn up. These were made out by him on local bank forms on previous visits and were probably exhibited to creditors in the meantime. The crown attorney is considering laying a charge against Wilson under the vagrancy act.

TIMBER ROYALTIES

Profit Sharing Between the Government and the Licensee

The Timber Royalty Act of British Columbia is chiefly significant in that it makes provision for the basing all timber royalties, subsequent January 1, 1920, on the sale value of the timber cut, over and above an arbitrarily fixed price of \$18 per the sand feet board measure. The percentage taken by the Government of this value-increase will be at first 1 per cent, gradually rising to 40 per cent, in the succeeding 25 years.

This is no new principle, for as early as 1889 the Dominion Government required from holders of timber limits in western Canada a royalty of 5 per cent. of the total sale value of the lumber cut, which value was to be based on the average price of lumber during the three months preceding the sale. But at that time the price of lumber was not sufficiently high to bring in any very large revenue on this percentage basis, so in 1910 the stumpage dues were changed to the fixed rate of 50 cents per the sand feet, board measure, which the rate at present. Although the retention of the percentage royalty would have secured larger returns from this source with the steadily rising lumber prices, yet the principle of selling the timber at a widely advertised public auction ensures the obtaining, through the additional bonus offered, practically the same price for the timber without the former inconvenience of constantly

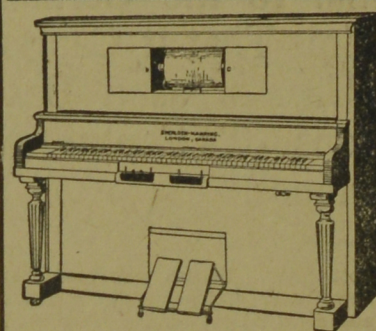
