On the night of February 25 last the Chinaman was found near the town with his throat terribly gashed. In a dying statement he is said to have accused Hardy of the crime.

### CLUBWOMEN THROG CITY OF CHICAGO

Chicago, Ill., June 9.—Chicago streets were thronged today with visiting club-women from all parts of the country, and the arrival of each train added to the number already in the city by hundreds. This great gathering of women, of whom 4,000 or more are expected as accredited delegates, with probably twice that number as visitors, is here for the twelfth biennial convention of the General Federation of Women's Clubs. A council meeting will be held tomorrow morning and the formal opening of the convention will be held in the Auditorium in the evening.

### OBLIGING.

Rev. Robert Crosser of Ohio does not believe in tiring his auditors and in this connection tells the tale of a rather "long winded" preacher of whom he knew.

### AN ELECTRIC RAZOR

For the benefit of the man with heavy beard and tender skin a razor has been invented which cuts the beard by a chopping action. An electric motor is connected by a flexible shaft to the shaft of the safety razor. On the end of the razor shaft cylindrical cams are provided which change the rotating movements to a reciprocating one within the blade holder. At the end of the holder this motion is again changed to one at right angles to the former, by means of a rocking arm and two prongs. Therefore the final motion of the blade is also a reciprocating one, causing the blade to act by means of blows against the hair.

Many blows per second are administered, depending upon the revolutions per minute of the motor. The action of the blade is therefore not really one of merely cutting, but rather of severing by blows. The logical result is that it is not necessary to have the blades as sharp as it is now demanded. The chief advantage, however, is the rapidity with which a first class shave can be accomplished, two to three minutes are sufficient. An application of soap is not necessary, wetting the skin is sufficient. The sensation after the shave is very agreeable, resembling that of a mild massage. The motor may be connected by a plug with any lamp socket.

### GETTING RID OF FLIES

They Quickly Vacate Places With Blue Tinted Walls

A French Journal states that it has been found that flies have a great objection to the color blue, and if tenements infested with flies are washed with a blue instead of a white wash, flies will desert the place. In support of this the following instance is reported. A farmer had 170 cows housed in different sheds; they were pestered with flies, but he observed that in one shed, the walls of which were a blue tint, the cows were not worried. He therefore added a blue color to the lime with which he washed the walls of his buildings, and from that time the flies deserted the place. The following formula is used by him for the wash:

To twenty gallons of water add 10 pounds of slacked lime and 1 pound of ultramarine. The washing is done twice during the summer.

### DANGEROUS CARGOES

The average landsman believes dynamite to be the worst cargo a ship can carry, but the sailor knows better. Jack would tell you that carbide of calcium is a deal more dangerous than dynamite. This is the chemical from which acetylene gas is made and the gas is constantly given off if the carbide is exposed to air. Some time ago the Hamburg barque "Hebe" was towed into Plymouth Sound in a disabled condition. Aboard her were 200 tons of carbide. All the war vessels in the Sound were ordered to take refuge, and the "Hebe" had to come in for repairs until the whole of her perilous cargo had been removed by a War Department barge.

The cargo carried by the barque "Volturno" was of a sort calculated to make a pretty bonfire. It included rags, peat moss, barrels of spirits, tar, and oils, together with drums of various chemicals. Small wonder that water had little effect in subduing the flames.

Chemicals form a very dangerous cargo, especially acids, such as nitric or sulphuric, which are both carried in tens of thousands of tons in the course of a year.

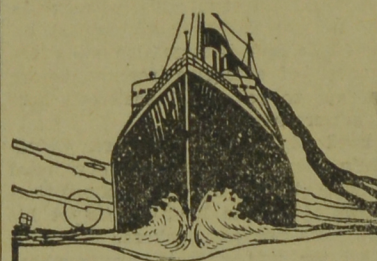
