le? Is there any one point which could have been worse handled? And then, as a byproduct, the universal anger and distrust which such a policy has aroused in the neutral countries! Yes, it really is a thing complete.

But the German soldier may prove himself as good as ever. That he will be brave as ever I have no doubt at all. That he will be hardy as ever is less likely, as the population of the Fatherland has drifted to the east, and his standard of comfort and even luxury has greatly increased.

COGWHEELS MAY STICK

The Westphalian artisan of William is of very different material to the Brandenburg peasant of Frederick as the short-service soldier of 1914 is very different to the 10-year man of 1750. I should expect to see the German now as good but no better than his neighbors. But the whole issue of this campaign, from his point of view, depends upon his being better. He has to win against superior numbers, and he must not only win but win quickly. If an equilibrium were established, the strangulation from England must bring victory to the Allies. It is a great deal the Kaiser has asked of his men.

And there is his much-vaunted military organization! An American friend of mine, who had means of forming an opinion, remarked to me: "Yes, it is a huge, smooth-running machine with delicate adjustments. Like all such machines, if a few cogwheels stuck the whole might ratchet itself to pieces."

A cogwheel stuck at Liege. Another may stick before long, and all will depend upon how the machine can adjust itself.

The lesson of history is ominous. The Prussians of Jena and Auerstadt were men who had been swollen up by the tradition of Frederick's prowess. Yet in a single day their defeat was so great and their power of recuperation so slight they were utterly dispersed. Their country for seven years ceased to exist as a factor in European politics.

They have always been great winners. They have not always been great in adversity. How will they now stand this test if it should come their way?

GYPSIES NOT WANTED.

Another band of gypsies, with four large vans, visited Fredericton this morning, but, like the other bands here earlier in the week, they were notified to immediately leave the city by City Detective James Roberts. It is reported that the other bands are camping a few miles below the city.

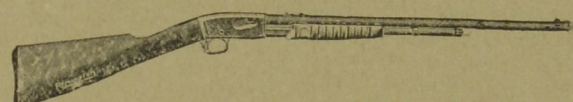

METHODISTS MEET AT MARYSVILLE

The Methodist district meeting was held in the Methodist Church at Marysville on Thursday. Rev. Thomas Marshall presided. Rev. George Steel, superintendent of missions delivered an address. It was stated that the Marysville and Gibson circuits would guarantee \$675 and \$725 for salary respectively, which amounts are to be supplemented from the sustentation fund.

A letter was read from Rev. Dr. Carman asking the meeting to suggest the name of a minister who would be available to act as chaplain

at the seat of war. The district submitted the name of Rev. E. Rowland. Chairman Hicks and Aid. Lemont were appointed a committee to visit weak circuits.

It was decided to hold a religious convention in Fredericton early in December, and Messrs. Marshall, Flemington, Lawson and Lemont were appointed a committee on arrangements. In the evening there was a public meeting addressed by Rev. George Steel and Rev. Thomas Marshall.
