### A Shrinking Sea

The surface of the Caspian, which lies 88 feet below sea level, has, since June, 1910, been continually sinking, without a plausible explanation having hitherto been found. It is believed that the river water flowing into the sea is not sufficient to make good the loss caused by evaporation.

### THE VALUE OF ART.

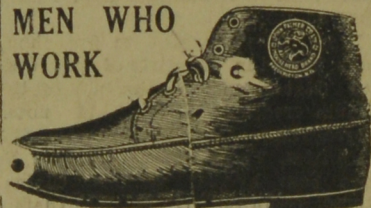
Some time ago an artist camped in a farmer's field to paint the landscape, and while busily engaged in putting in the beds, grass and things Uncle Josh rambled along.

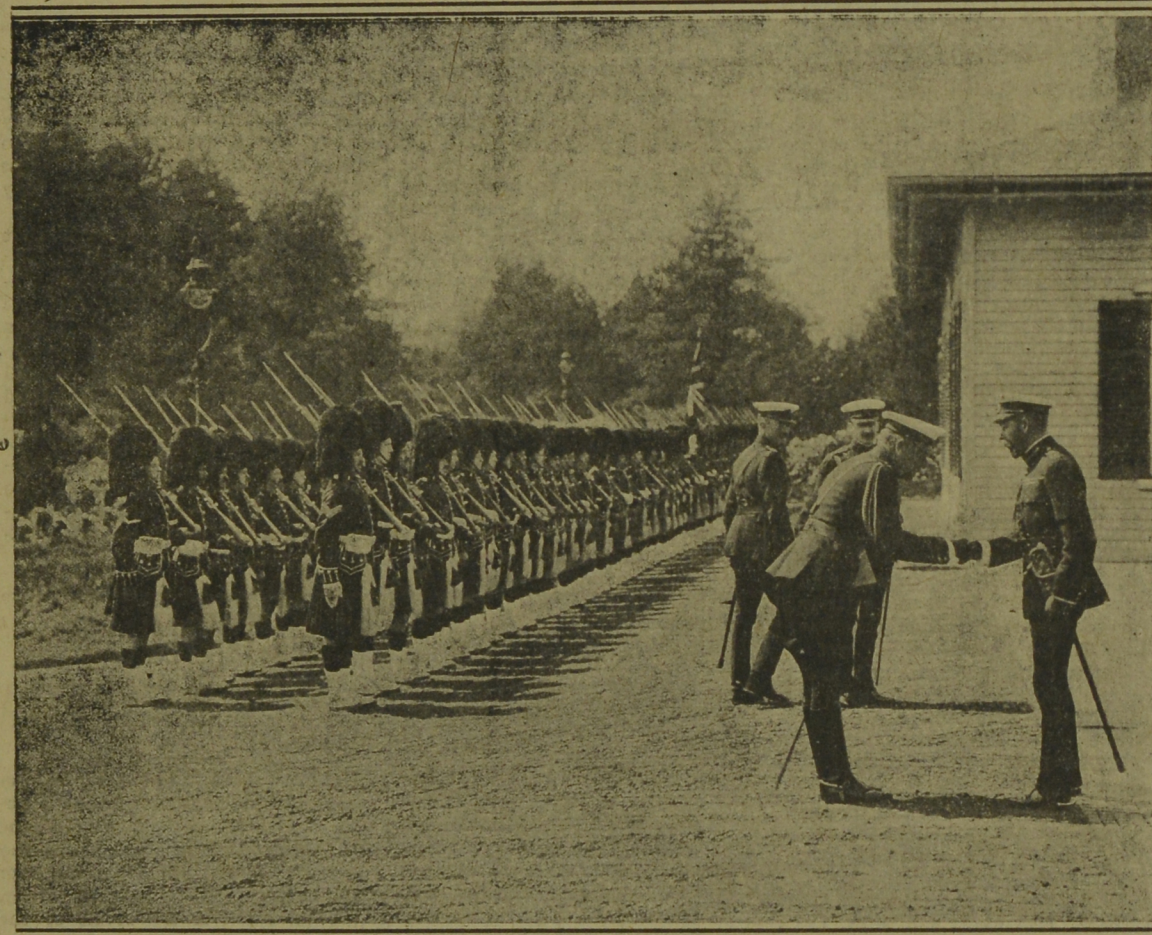
