## DARTMOUTH PAPER ON "GINGER POP" RULERS

(Dartmouth, N. S. Patriot)

Suppose the province of Ontario were divided into ten provinces, with ten legislatures, ten sets of officials, ten sets of public records, ten government houses and ten governors—it could not be a more absurd spectacle than the present division of Eastern Canada into three Provinces. Each with all the paraphernalia of independent countries.

No part of this complex machinery is more absurd and more subject to abuse than the institution of governorship and the appointment of ginger-pop governors.

A colonial court is a part of the British system of colonial administration. Men, of the rank title and high positions, and always of culture and education, were sent out as representatives to the crown of which the social side was not the last important.

Government House was consequently regarded as the head leader of social activities and it imparted an air and favor of dignity to the social life of any community.

For some time after confederation, the federal administration appointed the most distinguished of Canadians to lieutenant-governments, thereby preserving the traditions of the past. That time has passed. Men are no longer selected because of eminent service to the crown, or for their culture or learning of their social distinction.

Politicians who are in the way or in financial want and have a claim, generally lag it. The man gets it because he owes a long standing account to a leading politician who pulls the political strings and he gets the commission.

Another one is perhaps a Senator. His seat is wanted by the powers

that be. The trade is made. Men who accept a lieutenant governorship to get all there is in it, are not lavish in their social display or in anything that costs three cents. It is natural for them to assume the robe of the reformer. Social functions are to them "childish" and "trivialous." To crack a bottle of champagne is a sin, ginger-pop is an emblem of the highest virtues. When they had squandered their means in buying up voters, they suddenly become shining lights in reform and order circles or in electoral purity leagues. We heard of one of these severe moralists who could not meet the payment of an honest debt except by pleading the statute of limitations.

If Government House is a fiction let the salary become a fiction also.

Close it up and let the Chief Justice for the time being open and prorogue the House and sign the bills. The money it costs could be better expended on roads and bridges.

Mr. Blair recognizing the fatuousness of attempting to maintain a government house establishment with the material available abolished it at Fredericton. The Lieut. Governor when in Fredericton is put to the expense of living in a boarding house and the salary except two or three weeks board bill, is pure velvet.

The glaring anachronism of Government House is shown when a royal duke who is Governor General of Canada, in an official visit to this capital city, ties up the draft that brings him here to a wharf at the Dockyard and with his family and staff lives on board of her during his visit.

JEWISH NEW YEAR 5673

New York, Sept. 12.—The setting of the sun this evening ushers in the Jewish New Year 5673. The festival is one of the most important of the Jewish calendar and is sedulously observed by the reformed and orthodox alike. The orthodox carry the observance over two days, during which time they cease all work. The reformed Jews celebrate only one day.

There are more than sixty Jewish churches in Greater New York, but even this large number is insufficient to accommodate the large feast or fast days. This lack of adequate accommodation is not to be wondered at, in view of the fact that nearly 1,000,000, or considerably more than half of the total number of Jews in America, reside in this city.

For the present holiday season the Kehillah, or Jewish community of New York, has made arrangements to use a number of provisional synagogues. The organization has also made arrangements for the holding of services for the benefit of the Jewish inmates of the tuberculosis camp at Westfield, at the emigrant station at Ellis Island and in various other public institutions.
