

Court chambers before His Honor Mr, Justice Landry, ap-plication was made Thursday after-aoon on behalf of Samuel Frenette, a aoon on behalf of Samuel Frenette, a prisoner in the common goal of Rea-tigonche, under commitment for sel-ling liquor without a license, for his discharge on habeas corpus. Several grounds were urged attacking the legality of the arrest and the im-prisonment of the applicant. The Orisoner was imprisoned on August 31st last.
