Here is a most interesting passage from the report'

"The Nineteenth Infantry Brigade, which has been guarding the line of communications, was brought by rail to Valenciennes on the 22nd and 23 rd. On the morning of the 24th they were moved out to a position south of Quarouble, to support the ieft flank of the second corps. With the assistance of cavalry, Sir Horace Smith Dorrion was enabled to effect his' retreat to a new position, although having two corps of the enemy on his front and one threatening his flank. He suffered great losses in doing so.'

Other thrilling passages from 'the report are as follows

"The right was protected by the fortress of Maubeuge, the left by the nineteenth brigade in position between Jenlain and Bruay, and caval-ry 'on the outer flank. The French were still retiring and I had no support except such as was afforded by the fortress of Meubeuge, and deter mined efforts of the enemy to get around my flank assured me that it was his intention to hem me against Germans this winter, but France may that place and surround me.

"I felt that not a moment must lar. be lost in retiring to another posi-I had every reason to believe that the enemy's forces were somewhat exhausted and I knew that they had suffered heavy losses I hoped. therefore, that his pursuit would not be too vigorous to pre vent me effecting my object . operation, however, was full of dan-ger, and difficulty, not only owing to the very superior forces in front, but also the exhaustion of the

"The retirement was recommended in the early morning of the 25th to position in the neighborhood of Lecateau and the rear guard were ordered to be clear of Maubeuge and Bavay by 5.30 a. m. Two cavalry brigades, with the divisional cavalry of the second corps, covered the movement of the second corps and the remainder of the cavalry divi-sion with the nineteenth brigade, the whole under command of General Al-

They have furnished me with most complete and accur ate information which has been incalculable value in the conduct of operations. They were fired at constantly, both by friend and foe, and not hesitating to fly in every kind of weather they have remained undaunted throughout. Further, by ac tual fighting, they destroyed five of the enemy's machines .: '



GERMAN RIGHT WING

NOW A MOB

Ghent, Sept. 14-On every side the etreating German army is being sorely pressed by the British, who are driving the routed right wing everywhere before it, and inflicting upon it terrific losses. Each mile of its etreat is marked by dead ed and abandoned artillery and bag gage Wagons

The invading army seems to have had its Moscow, and its Waterlog cannot now be long delayed. German right wing has been shatter ed to atoms. It is simply a fugitive mob, which flies night and day, hoping to shake off the pursuer, who as for days been hunting it down. The Vanguard of the fleeing Teutonic host has now re-crossed the Belgian frontier.

Owing to the recrudescence of Belgian military activity the position of the slender garrison holding Brussels has become one of extreme peril. Important Belgian forces appeared north and east of Brussels after the ourning of Termonde and Malle. Thesa modern huns of the German Kaiser retreated upon Alost, which comman is the road northwest of Brussels. Their occupation of this town now is seriously menaced by a powerful Beligian concentration in the neighborhood and it is possible that the enemy will shortly find Brussels untenable and be compelled to evacuate

Brussels is garrisoned chiefly by sailors and marines from the immooilized fleet. The sailors took part the four days' fighting northwest of Brussels, and they suffered severely in attempting to repel the impetuous Belgian attact.
