WESTERN TEACHERS APPLY FOR POSITIONS HERE

The school trustees held their
monthly meeting yesterday and dis-
posed of some waiting business. Dr.
VanWart, chairman, presided, and
the other gentlemen in attendance
included Mr. Sterling, Mr. Weddall,
Mr. Sharkey, Mr. Spurden and Mr.
Lemont. The secretary reported that
in accordance with official intimation
he had notified Mrs. Cox of the
meeting.

After nine years' faithful service,
Mrs. Margaret Lynch handed her re-
signation to the government and
very general regret was expressed by
her former associates at the sever-
ance of official ties. Mrs. Lynch has
not been enjoying very good health
for some time past. The secretary
was instructed to forward to her a
suitable paper upon her withdrawal.

Several communications were read
and disposed of, including one from
the manager of the Bank of N.B.A.
in reference to the issue of debentures.
A number of circulars and
requests continue to reach the secre-
tary from persons and firms ready to
supply needed stock for the new
school building, including all the
newest ideas in furniture.

WESTERN APPLICANTS.

Applications from teachers in the
far west of Canada and also from the
United States, as well as from our
own provinces, were read, asking
for positions on the city staff. Some
teachers have evidently arrived at the
conclusion that there are worse
places than New Brunswick.

The chairman and Mr. Spurden,
from the committee, reported that
they had given permission to the
C.P.R. authorities to remove some
dangerous trees near their track and
in front of the Morrison Mill school-
house. This committee visited the

school while in that vicinity and were
well pleased with what they saw.

Mr. Lemont thought some effort
should be made to provide more
spacious playgrounds for the children
in this suburban section of the city,
and Mr. Sharkey was added to the
above committee to study the situa-
tion and endeavor to bring the school
grounds up to date.

The chairman said he had heard
some complaints about the dilapidat-
ed condition of the school at Doak
Settlement but the secretary said it
was in fair condition.

Upon the motion of Mr. Sterling,
Mr. Weddall and Mr. Spurden will
visit the Doak school and report
back.

PREPARING FOR CLOSING.

The secretary reported that Mr.
Harrison is anxious to group the
several grades of the schools for
music practises with the view of pre-
paration for the public closing exer-
cises and asks to have several rehear-
sals in the Opera House. At the
suggestion of Mr. Sterling, Mr. Le-
mont was asked to make necessary
arrangements without expense to the
board.

Upon Mr. Weddall's motion the
secretary will forward to Mrs. Lynch
a copy of the resolution expressing
the board's regret that owing to
indisposition she has felt obliged to
resign her official position as trustee.

The secretary reported particulars
respecting temporary changes among
the teachers, owing to illness. Also
that Mrs. J. Simpson is in charge of
the school at Morrison Mill, vacated
by the resignation of Miss Margaret
Gray Coburn.

Payment of salaries was ordered
and a number of accounts passed,
after which the board adjourned.
