



London, Sept. 3-The first consign nent of Canadian flour arrived by the Tunisian on Monday, and accord-ing to arrangements made by the local government board will he stored at various ports until required. # LOOKING AFTER YOUNG CHICK

Plenty of Shade and Good Wholeson Food Cive Best Results

Green food is absolutely essenti. during the growing period. It can b most economically supplied by grow ing it directly upon the range. Whe clippings or sprouted grains, says Ha ry Lewis of New Jersey College Agriculture, in Suburban Life. range which can be kept seeded t a permanent sod is the best, but, when as to destroy the grass, it will b two plots, and rotate them by altern: ing the areas asd raising quick-grow ing, succulent crops, such as peas and during the winter, as a catch or cover crop, rye, wheat, vetch and crimson clover, singly or in combination. The birds can then eat the succulence directly off the root, and the plowing and seeding purify the runs and utilize the manure to grow the crop. abundance of shade is necessary fo normal, healthy development sheiters must be constructed. 



# Postman Walked 126,000 Miles


