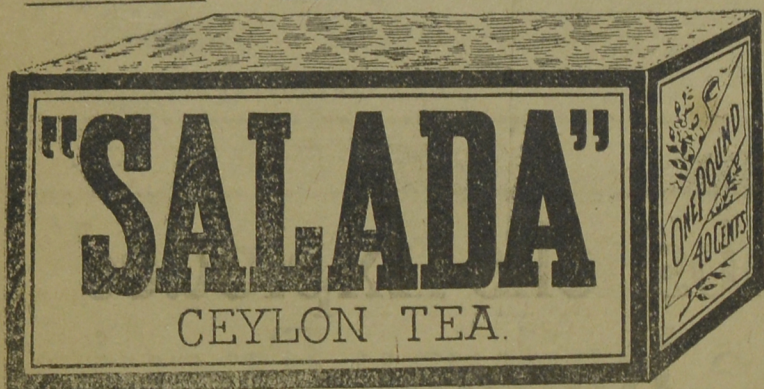

### TO STUDY URBAN CONDITIONS ABROAD

New York, July 9—A commission organized by the Southern Commercial Congress to study urban conditions and achievements in various countries of Europe sailed from this city today for England. The commission is headed by Senator Fletcher of Florida and includes the payors of a number of cities, officials of civic and commercial organizations and representatives appointed by various state governors.

The commission will first attend the International Congress of Municipal Executives and Civic Leaders, which opens in London July 20. Later it will participate in the international urban exposition at Lyons and then make an extensive tour of investigation in France, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, Austria-Hungary, Belgium and Holland.

### READY TO LAUNCH NEW DREADNOUGHT

Quincy, Mass., July 10—At the yards of the Fore River Ship Building Company in this city a small army of workmen was employed today in making the final preparations for the launching of the United States battleship Nevada. The big vessel will make her maiden plunge early tomorrow afternoon in the presence of Secretary Daniels of the Navy Department, Governor Odie of Nevada and a number of other notable guests. The Nevada is a sister ship to the Oklahoma, and is of the latest dreadnought type.

The Shuberts will star Sam Mann next season in a play called "The Morning After," by Lee Arthur, author of "The Auctioneer."

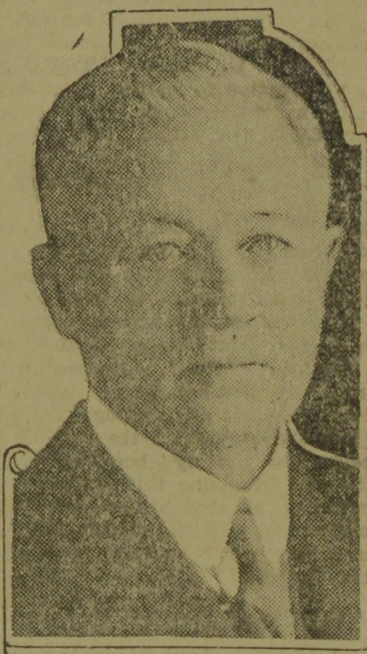
### WIRELESS AND FIRE

No Danger to Vessels From sparking in Rigging

The published reports of sparking in the rigging of ships carrying wireless and the calling of the attention of the shipping world to the possible danger to vessels carrying inflammable cargoes, caused the British Board of Trade to make an inquiry. But according to the Marconi Company there is not the slightest danger from wireless when properly installed and operated. The company conducted searching experiments and made a full investigation.

"Since 1908 we have fitted about forty tank steamers with our apparatus," said a high official of the Company, "and nothing in our whole experience indicates that the fire-risk is increased thereby. Any possible risk from the use of wireless installation on shipboard must arise from the existence of electric sparks in proximity to inflammable gas or material. For instance, one firm of shipowners made the following experiment to ascertain what danger, if any, might arise from the existence of sparks in the rigging as well as in the instrument room.

"A saucerful of naphtha was placed as close as possible to a heavy spark. A piece of waste, saturated with naphtha was also placed close to the spark electrodes, but in neither experiment was the vapor ignited by the spark. The same naphtha test was also applied to the small sparks at minor parts of the apparatus and nothing happened.

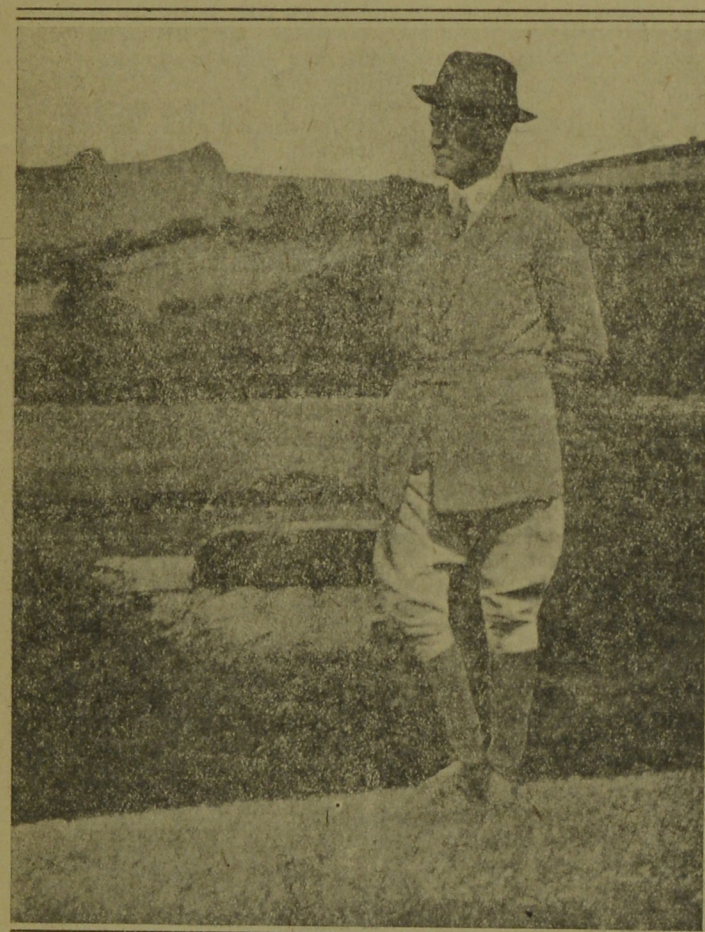
