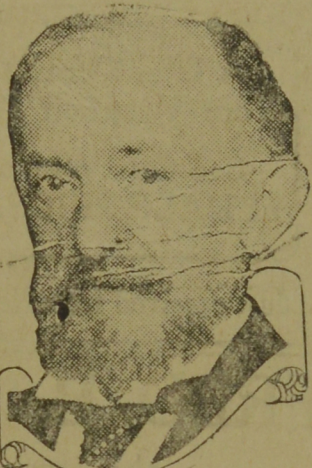

RAISING POULTRY

Only those who have tried chicken raising can form any adequate idea of the passionate interest these beautiful fowls inspire. They lead themselves perfectly to scientific treatment in various respects; they are harmless, confiding, and affectionate; they are comparatively little liable to diseases when properly cared for; they appeal strongly to children as companions and pets; and they may, with care and attention, but without hard toil, become a means of making a pleasant and profitable living.

An enormous step in advance was made when the incubator was invented, and another when there was produced the comfortable and safe retreat that fills, to some extent, the place of the natural mother. The cost of poultry production has been reduced these means very much reduced, and the net profits correspondingly increased. Moreover, it is just as easy, as in the case of dairy cows to detect and eliminate the hen that is a good feeder but a poor layer. There is enough in the poultry industry to keep both body and mind in activity. —The Toronto Globe.

GIRL ELOPED WITH CHAUFFEUR

Montreal, July 8—Fern Hallian, the eighteen-year-old Boston girl, and Louis Eisman, her father's chauffeur, with whom she eloped, were located yesterday on a train speeding toward Quebec. J. H. Hallian, the wealthy father, had offered \$100 reward for information leading to her discovery and yesterday he made a new will, curbing her off without a cent as long as Eisman is with her. According to a Boston despatch Hallian may prosecute the chauffeur under the Mann White Slave Act.

HEADED FOR MONTREAL.

Eisman, the chauffeur, formerly of the Hallian family, is twenty-three years of age and has been in the employ of Hallian for some time. There was no suspicion in the family that a tenderness was developing between the debutante of Boston society, and the man who drove her on shopping tours, so that early yesterday morning the pair secured a long start without pursuit. The chauffeur was first missed by some of the servants, but it was only a short time before the absence of the daughter of the house was also learned of. Putting two and two together, Hallian exerted his wealth and influence to trace the movements of both and it was not long before he was informed that they had left for Montreal. Notification was sent to the Montreal police and detectives watched all points of entry.

CHANGED THEIR PLANS.

The eloping couple made a change of plan in the afternoon. At Richmond they left the train and proceeded toward Quebec. The explanation of their change of destination apparently due to the information telegraphed to them by a sister of Eisman, who lives in Montreal. Her name does not appear in the city directory, but her address was only learned by the detectives on the case who notified the police in the City of Quebec. Orders were sent along the railway line to be on the lookout for them and their discovery was effected. The father was informed and requested to send instructions.

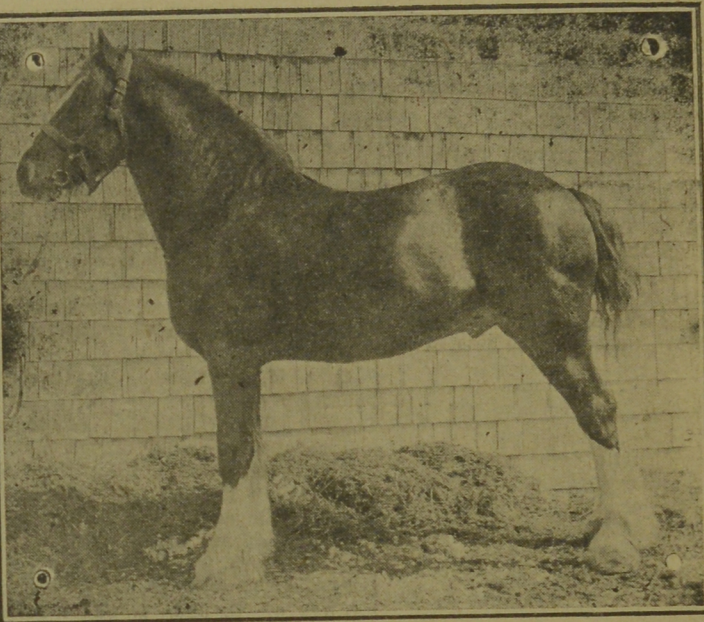
