imposed upon the two women and he knows that a clerk from the office of P. A. Guthrie, who had acted as counsel for the defendants in that case, brought the money to pay the fines late in the afternoon, the two women in the meantime staying in the cells. The other six fines of five dollars each imposed upon four men and two women, were paid in the court-room and handed by him to the magistrate, together with a deposit of eight dollars, making a total of thirty-eight dollars.

Mayor Mitchell and Wm. McKay, members of the police commission, interviewed the police magistrate this morning on the subject. Chairman McKay stated later that an investigation would be held Friday afternoon.

Press reports of the case with which this matter is connected, stated that fines of five dollars were imposed upon each of the four men and four women concerned.
