## U. N. B. MOCK PARLIAMENT OPENED SATURDAY NIGHT

The opening of the annual Mock Parliament of the undergraduates of the University of New Brunswick took place on Saturday evening in the College Library. In accordance with the result of the previous election the Conservatives were in power on the motion of Premier E. C. Rice seconded by Hon. H. H. VanWart, minister of Trade and Commerce, Mr. J. B. Hipwell was elected Speaker for the coming session. Immediately after this the arrival of His Excellency, Governor General Melrose was announced by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod and permission was given he was conveyed to the throne in the state wheelbarrow and accompanied by his private secretary Mr. R. Thompson, and escorted by the guard of honor commanded by Lt. Col. G. A. Good.

In his speech from the throne His Excellency referred to the gratifying advance made under his government during the past year and touched upon the proposed bills to be introduced during the coming session, among them being the appointment

of a royal commission on the N. T. C. Railway. In addition to bills providing for a direct contribution to the Imperial Navy and Redistribution of the elective districts, mention was made of the hostile armies from Mount Allison, Acadia and Kings. Gratification was expressed over the fact that these attacks had been successfully repelled.

The address in reply to the speech from the Throne was moved by Hon. Mr. Arthur VanWart seconded by Mr. O. G. Willet, each of whom acquitted himself in a most commendable manner. Hon. R. L. Simms, leader of the opposition discussed the speech from the throne at great length and indulged in many attacks on the Government. He was replied to by Premier Rice, who in a few able remarks explained the stand taken by the Government on the proposed legislation as set forth in the speech from the throne. Immediately after this a motion to adjourn was made, and the members of the Legislature together with the usual large crowd of spectators retired to the lower hall where a program of fifteen dances was indulged in.

### SENATE TO STAY ON LIBERAL SIDE

Ottawa, March 13.—It seems well assured that the Liberals will be able to retain a majority in the senate during the whole of the present Parliament. The standing in the upper chamber at present is: Liberals 53, Conservatives 32, vacancies 2. The two vacancies were caused by the death of Senator Cox and Sir Geo. Ross. When the vacancies are filled the Liberal majority will be 19; when the new senators from the west are appointed the majority will be reduced to 10. There is a rumor in the lobbies that the senate will reject the bill of Mr. Borden to give the nine new members to which it is entitled.

When Mr. Borden became premier, the completion of the senate was: Liberals 66, Conservatives 19, vacancies 2, the Liberal majority being 47. Mr. Borden filled the two vacancies with Conservatives leaving the Liberal majority 45. During the past two years 17 senators have died, 13 of them being Liberals and four Conservatives. With the two vacancies already mentioned, the Liberal majority has been reduced in this short time to 21. Their successors will make the majority 19.

There are 33 members of the upper house over 70 years of age, 21 being Liberals and 12 Conservatives. Ex-Premier Sir MacKenzie Bowell is the oldest man in the parliament, and is one of the most active. He is 91. Two Quebec senators came next in age—Hon. G. C. Desaulles of St. Hyacinthe, who is 87, and Hon. L. J. Sheyn of Quebec who is 85.

### CHICAGO HOTEL MURDER CASE

Chicago, Ill., March 16.—John B. ("Handsome Jack") Koettters was brought into court today to stand trial on a charge of having murdered Mrs. Emma Kraft, a Cincinnati widow, who was found beaten to death in her room in the Saratoga Hotel in this city on November 14, 1912. Koettters, who was suspected of the crime, eluded capture until a month ago, when he was found in San Francisco and returned to this city for trial.

### IMPROVED SLIGHTLY

A report from the home of City Clerk J. W. McCready this afternoon is to the effect that he appears to be stronger and is able to take more nourishment. He is confined to his bed.

### SECRETARY McADOO TO WED MISS WILSON

Washington, March 13.—"The President and Mrs. Wilson announce the engagement of their youngest daughter, Eleanor Randolph, to Hon. William Gibbs McAdoo."

This announcement was issued at the White House by Secretary Tamm tonight after a day of speculation in capital, official and social circles over the prospect of another White House wedding in June.

Mr. McAdoo is a widower and fifty-one years old. He has six children and two grandchildren. One daughter and one son are married. Mr. McAdoo's late wife was Sarah Houston Fleming, who died about five years ago. The secretary is well preserved and full of spirit. He entered into the social activities of the capital with zest from the moment he joined the cabinet.

Miss Wilson is twenty-four years old. She is dark, tall and slender, and has great charm of manner. Up to the time of her father's inauguration she was a student in the Academy of Fine Arts in Philadelphia. She attended school at St. Mary's in Raleigh, N.C., and from there went to Goucher College in Baltimore, where she was graduated, as was her sister, Mrs. Sayre.

### HEARING AT ST. JOHN.

The Divorce Court adjourned Saturday until March 28 where the case of King vs King is to be heard at St. John. The defendant Harry King, resides in Fredericton.

The rumor that Premier Fleming is finding the job of keeping his hungry followers in line a very strenuous one this season. He has informed several of his intimate friends that the burden laid upon him is greater than he can bear and that he has about made up his mind to quit the job.

### U. S. PARCEL POST NOW TAKES BOOKS

Washington, D. C. March 16.—Under a new ruling of the Post Office Department put into effect today, books are now accepted for transmission by the parcel post. The rates are the same as on other articles, except that books weighing eight ounces or less are to cost one cent for each two ounces or fraction thereof.

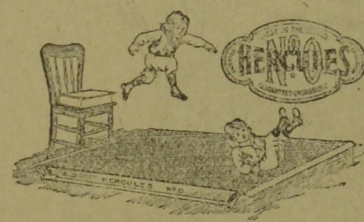
