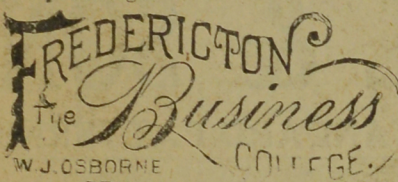

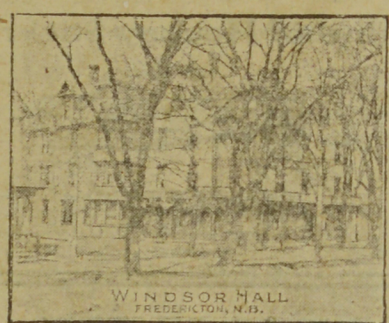

NESBIT CASE LOOKS
LIKE FLAT FAILURE

(Toronto Globe.)

It was authoritatively stated in Toronto recently that the crown had failed to successfully prove an indictment under the criminal code of Canada to meet the charge set out in the papers by which Dr. W. Beattie Nesbitt was extradited from Chicago. It is true that the crown did prefer five indictments before the grand jury charging that Dr. Beattie Nesbitt wilfully made false returns on the bank's position to the Dominion government. This is said not to be an extraditable offence and in order to make it so before the Extradition Commission at Chicago, it is claimed by the defence that the word "fraudulently" was inserted by the police officer in connection with the charge. Making false returns to the government, a charge under the Bank Act, is not an extraditable offence and in order to have Dr. Beattie Nesbitt made a subject for extradition it was found necessary to set out that he was wanted on a fraud charge.

Mr. H. H. Dewart, K.C., counsel for Dr. Beattie Nesbitt, when spoken to, declined to discuss the point as to whether the indictments brought in by the grand jury on Tuesday were good or bad in law.

UNFAIR TO DEFENCE.

Mr. Dewart, however, said it was an indignant position for the crown to take. His client was not allowed to plead to an indictment. It is not within the flower of defence counsel to file "a demurrer to the indictment," said Mr. Dewart until a prisoner is arraigned and has pleaded to a charge.

WILL ATTACK INDICTMENT

Dr. Nesbitt's counsel observed that he believed he could have success-

fully attacked the indictment and satisfied Sir William Munk or any other Judge on the Bench that there is no such charge in the criminal code of "fraudulently" making false returns to the Government of the bank's financial position.

THE MISSING LETTER

Mr. Dewart when asked why so much had been made by the Crown of the missing letter, said the original communication would be demanded at the trial. "But understand," said Mr. Dewart, "this case is not yet to trial."

Mr. Dewart said the Crown could say that they had been taken by surprise. It is over six months, he said, since the extradition proceedings in Chicago.

At that time I pointed out to the Commissioner that the Crown was proceeding "illegally" in pressing a charge of fraudulently making false returns. The Commissioner ruled otherwise, so I just kept quiet and let them go on to the position the Crown officers found themselves in to-day.

DR. NESBITT READY

Mr. Dewart also pointed out that his client was ready for trial. Defence counsel said that he had discussed the case with the Crown Prosecutor, Mr. Meredith, who feared that Dr. Beattie Nesbitt would not be able to go on owing to poor health. "My client will be ready for trial," declared Mr. Dewart, who asked his learned friend to have the Crown witnesses ready to go on the stand. Mr. Dewart then informed Mr. Meredith that he intended to move to set the indictments aside.

"The position taken by the Crown in not allowing my client to plead was the barrier to attack on the Crown's case as set out in the indictment."

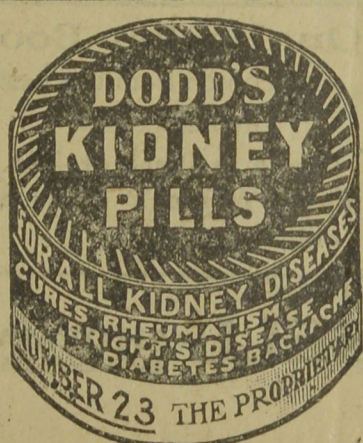

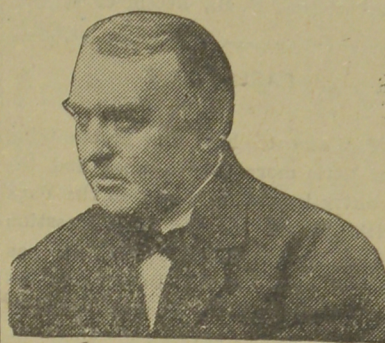
