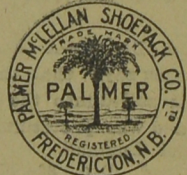

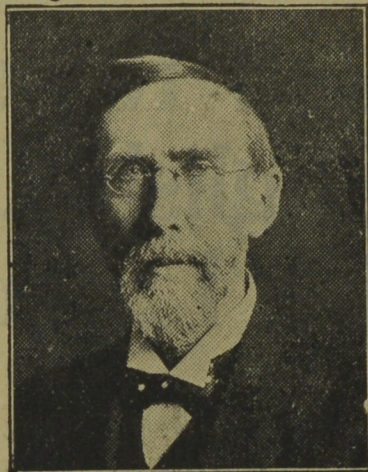

CRITICAL STAGE OF WAR OVER SAYS FOSTER

Ottawa, December 21.—Although the
war has not yet been won the daily
critical time has been passed, because
the idea of an invincible German army
has been broken, declared Hon. Geo.
Geo. E. Foster in an eloquent and
earnest address at the First Baptist
Church here tonight.

"We have got over the idea of the
might and organization of the German
army, their tremendous munitions of
war, their great guns and all. The
world was trained to think for years
that that army was all powerful.
When the war came there was a great
anxiety to see if the British were
equal, man for man, battalion for
battalion, and army for army, with
the Germans, and whether the keen
French troops would stand up before
the German advance.

ALLIES VINDICATED

"Happily the French soldiers have
shown a steadfastness of purpose and
thoroughness of discipline that has
enabled them to stand firm, to ad-
vance and retreat when necessary, un-
der the perfect control of their offi-
cers. And the British soldiers have
proved again to the world, as they
have done many times before, that
taken all in all, there is no soldier in
British Tommy.

"The German army has no points
over the allied armies, and the idea of
the German superiority is broken.

"But some ask, why doesn't the
fleet do something? The silent fleet,
lost amid the fogs and storms of the
North Sea—hidden, mysterious, silent
patient as the ages—is not idle, but
because of what it has done the world's
business has gone on almost the same
as before the war, and soldiers were
conveyed eight thousand to ten thou-
sand miles over the without a man
being injured.

CANADA'S NEW PARK

Old Trading Post Stood in Midst of
Beautiful Forest Tract

Forty-seven years ago two adven-
turous young Englishmen, Victor
Milton and Dr. Cheadle, after passing
the winter in a Saskatchewan forest
set out from Edmonton to cross the
Rocky Mountains and to reach the
Pacific coast by the overland route.
After a most laborious journey, at-
tended with much hardship and of a
much danger, they accomplished their
purpose. They crossed the Rockies
by way of the Yellowhead Pass, which
accurate surveys have since deter-
mined to be the easiest passage
through the mountains, and is the
route followed by the Grand Trunk
Pacific Railway on its passage over
the great divide. On their journey
they arrived at Jasper House, an an-
cient landmark, even at that time, in
the geography of this part of Canada.
One hundred years ago Jasper House
was one of the most important trad-
ing posts of the Hudson Bay Company
in all the far North-west. It was
built in the year 1809 by Jasper
Hawes, who is frequently referred to
by the early explorers of the upper
Rockies.

The site of the old trading post is
now the centre of Jasper Park. The
playground of scenic beauty and
largely unexplored areas has been set
aside by the Federal Government of
Canada and will be preserved in a
state of nature so far as such con-
dition is consistent with the purpose
for which the reserve is created. It
will be open to the holidaymaker and
the tourist; to the explorer, for much
of it in detail is still an unknown land
to the student of nature, to the artist
and to those wishing to study at first
hand the problems of forestry in a
country where forests will be pre-
served in their natural state.
