STRANGE DREAMS
AND THEIR PORTENTS

Do People of the Present Age Still Believe in the Supernatural?
—It Would Seem So

Most people have, deep down in their natures, a private and unconfessed faith in dreams, premonitions, forebodings, says the Toronto Star. Some hard-headed business men will not start on an important journey or embark on a big business venture on a Friday, although they do not actually say so, and you may do business with them for years without finding it out. They contrive matters so that it is never necessary to admit that they have a fear of Friday. It would be too absurd a thing to admit, and they do not actually confess it to themselves. Or if they ever admit it to themselves or to their closest friends they speak of it, not as a real superstition, but as a humorous little oddity which interests and amuses them. The present age is one of levity, but the truth is that mankind is strongly pre-disposed towards superstition and to a belief in the supernatural.

Strange stories are told in connection with the loss of the Empress of Ireland. People had dreams, premonitions, and forebodings. We have no wish to express a doubt as to the truthfulness of anybody who relates an experience of this kind. In fact, we see no reason for doubting the truth of all the evidence produced but we see no reason for assuming that these dreams and forebodings were a bit different from what they would have been if the Empress of Ireland had enjoyed a prosperous voyage. What we mean to say is that when a thousand people are asked to make a journey by sea, there will be among them, and among their relatives, many who will have dreams and forebodings, which will possess significance if a shipwreck occurs, but which will possess no significance at all and will never be heard of if the journey is a happy one.

There is the story of the ship which, although it had a strong board, ran away, and although braced back, escaped again and did not see the Empress. The story will go into tradition. About it we would say that it needs to be verified. Even if verified, we would expect to find the explanation in the life and action of the cat, rather than in any mysterious foreknowledge or foreboding of the animal that in a future form the captain of two ships were understood each other and a disaster.

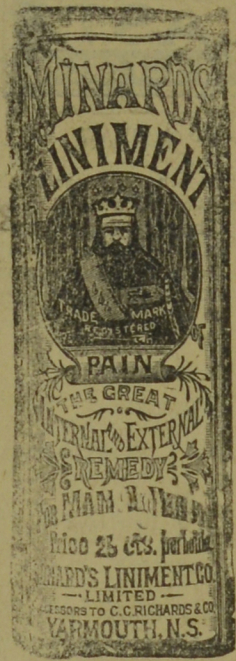
HORSE AS FOOD

Tourists Get it For Beef in France—
Said to be Wholesome

Appropos of the discussion in Parliament regarding the eating of horseflesh in Montreal, it is interesting to note that the London Chronicle gave prominence to a letter from Mr. F. Langworthy, of Claygate, Surrey, advocating the establishment of horseflesh butchers' shops in the large towns of Great Britain.

He declares that as horseflesh is now eaten by "our rich," he sees no reason why the poor should go without this cheap meat simply "because there is no one with sufficient enterprise to try to overcome a prejudice." He further says that he has seen English people very contentedly eating horse for beef in some of the most expensive hotels in Paris, and for himself he would much sooner eat it than the flesh of the pig.

His theory is that the meat of animals that have been cooped up—such as pigs in styes, cattle in barns, and owls in runs—is not wholesome, while the meat of horses, which lead fairly natural lives, is cheap and nourishing; indeed, he adds, the French say that horseflesh is particularly good for those suffering from anemia.

LOCOMOTIVES TOW SHIPS

Forty "Electric Mules" Will Operate at Panama Canal

The forty towing locomotives for hauling vessels through the locks of the Panama Canal weigh 82,700 pounds; measure 32 feet 3 1/2 inches long by 8 feet wide by 9 feet 3 inches the greatest height over the cabs have an available tractive effort as high as 47,500 pounds, and a winding rope pull of 25,000 pounds, and of them, two on each side, will ordinarily propel steamships through the locks. Sometimes six engines will be needed to handle extra large vessels; in every case two astern, acting as a brake on the ship's movements will give direction to her course. No vessel will be allowed to enter the locks and go through on her own power. The locomotive is propelled by means of a rack rail while towed and while going up or down the steep grades from one level to another at a speed of two miles per hour. While running idle or on return tracks the speed is changed to five miles per hour, and the machine is propelled by the regular traction method, the track pinion being entirely released. This change is effected by manually operated clutches located in the gear mechanism in connection with a lever in each cab similar to a steam locomotive. The locomotive is driven by two 75 horse-power totally enclosed motors of the mill type, one being direct connected through reduction to each axle.

HOW DO YOU SLEEP

Owls, in addition to their eyelids have a screen that they draw across their eyes to shut out the light, so they sleep in the daytime.
