





A HERO IN BATTLE


Paris, Dec. 25-Among officers men tioned in despatches from the front is Major 'Haldal De Lys, a descendant of the family to which Joan of Arc belonged, who commanded a battalion of the 162 Infantry Regiment, with the greatest bravery and utter disdain of danger from October 10 tc November 9. He is recorded in the official journal as an officer of the greatest value.

#### 357,400 PRISONERS

London, Dec. 25-According to a etrograd despatch to Reuter's Telegram Company, the number of Ger man prisoners registered is 1,140 officers and 131,700 men; the number of Austrians registered is 3,166 offi cers and 221,400 men.

The Slav prisoners have asked for Russian naturalization, so that they may be sent against the Turks. London, Dec. 25-Christmas brought no rest to the embattled European armies. 
