Behan, that Mr. Taft would give them consideration with the other bidders, so a committee of three will come to Cincinnati from Chicago tomorrow night to see him.

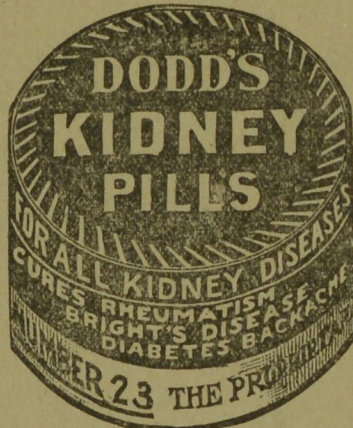
HERE FOR SESSION.

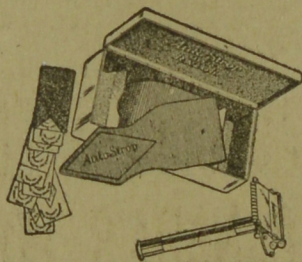
