## HOT CHASE AFTER ROBBERS IN PARIS

Paris, April 23—Count Maximilian Von Montgelas, a Bavarian nobleman, and four persons who were with him, were arrested in broad daylight today after a hot chase on the boulevards and charged with attempting to steal jewels valued at \$120,000 from a jeweler's salesman. The Countess Von Montgelas, who is the divorced wife of an Australian officer, also was arrested after a search of her apartment disclosed a large quantity of property which the police say was stolen.
